the United States Constitution has been proposed in Congress which simply states "the Supreme Court of the United States shall be composed of nine justices"; and

WHEREAS, the "Keep Nine Amendment" was introduced as House Joint Resolution 95 in the House of Representatives on September 24, 2020, with bipartisan sponsorship by then Representatives Collin Peterson (D-MN) and Denver Riggleman (R-VA), with cosponsors Mo Brooks (R-AL5), Michael San Nicolas (D-GU-At-large), Doug LaMalfa (R-CA1), and Ken Buck (R-CO4); and

11 WHEREAS, a number of former state attorneys general 12 oppose "packing the court", and recent polls have shown that 13 voters support a "Keep Nine Amendment" by more than a three to 14 one margin; and

WHEREAS, President Biden is currently forming a study commission on Supreme Court reform that has "court expansionists" as its leaders; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, That this body strongly urges the Alabama Congressional Delegation to support the pending "Keep Nine Amendment" as filed in the United States Senate and House of Representatives.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That a copy of this resolution be provided to the Alabama Congressional Delegation and the Attorney General for the State of Alabama.
