Relating to law enforcement officers; to require the
 Alabama Peace Officers' Standards and Training Commission to

Section 1. (a) For the purposes of this act, a law
enforcement officer is a state, county or municipal law
enforcement officer certified by the Alabama Peace Officers'
Standards and Training Commission.

(b) By January 1, 2022, the Alabama Peace Officers' Standards and Training Commission shall provide not less than hours of instruction relating to Mental Health Awareness, which incorporates the concepts of crisis intervention, as part of the curriculum of training required under Section 36-21-46, Code of Alabama 1975, to all law enforcement trainees within the commission's jurisdiction.

(c) A law enforcement officer certified by the
commission prior to January 1, 2022, shall complete the Mental
Health Awareness program required under subsection (a) by
January 1, 2025.

(d) The commission shall annually review and update
the training to include changes and trends in mental health
awareness for first responders.

(e) The commission may adopt rules for the
 implementation and administration of this act.

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Section 2. This act shall become effective
 immediately following its passage and approval by the
 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
