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4	ENROLLED, An Act,
5	Relating to cottage food production operations; to
6	amend Section 22-20-5.1, Code of Alabama 1975; to allow
7	various methods of sales by cottage food production
8	operations; to remove the existing cap on gross receipts by
9	cottage food production operations; and to require cottage
10	food production operations to include certain nutrition
11	information on the label of each product offered for sale.
12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
13	Section 1. Section 22-20-5.1, Code of Alabama 1975,
14	is amended to read as follows:
15	"§22-20-5.1.
16	"(a) For purposes of this section, the following
17	words have the following meanings:
18	" <del>(1)</del> BAKED GOOD. Includes cakes, breads, Danish,
19	donuts, pastries, pies, and other items that are prepared by
20	baking the item in an oven. A baked good does not include a
21	potentially hazardous food item as defined by rule of the
22	department.
23	"(1) COTTAGE FOOD. A non-potentially hazardous food
24	that has been prepared in a person's home that does not
25	require time or temperature central for cafety to limit

Τ	pathogenic microorganism growth or toxin formation and that
2	does not include meat, poultry, or fish, including the
3	<pre>following:</pre>
4	a. Cakes, breads, Danish pastries, donuts, pastries,
5	and pies.
6	b. Jam, jellies, and fruit preserves.
7	c. Candy.
8	d. Dried and dehydrated herbs, herb mixes,
9	vegetables, or fruits.
10	e. Roasted coffee.
11	f. Dried baking mixes.
12	g. Fermented or preserved vegetables or fruit that
13	do not result in the production of alcohol and that have an
14	acidity level allowed by the department.
15	"(2) COTTAGE FOOD PRODUCTION OPERATION. A person
16	operating out of his or her home who meets all of the
17	following requirements:
18	"a. Produces <del>a baked good, a canned jam or jelly, a</del>
19	dried herb or herb mix, or a candy cottage food for sale at
20	the person's home.
21	"b. Has an annual gross income of twenty thousand
22	dollars (\$20,000) or less from the sale of food described in
23	<del>paragraph a.</del>

1	" <del>(c)</del> <u>b.</u> Sells the foods produced under paragraph a.
2	only directly to consumers, whether in-person, by phone, or
3	online in the state.
4	"c. Delivers the foods produced under paragraph a.
5	directly to consumers in the state, whether in person, through
6	an agent of the producer, or by mail.
7	"(3) DEPARTMENT. The State Department of Public
8	Health.
9	"(4) HOME. A primary residence that contains a
10	kitchen and appliances designed for common residential use.
11	"(b) A cottage food production operation is not a
12	food service establishment and is not required to have a food
13	service permit issued by the county health department.
14	"(c) Neither the State Department of Public Health
15	nor a county health department may regulate the production of
16	food at a cottage food production operation except as provided
17	by this section.
18	"(d) The department may issue a stop sale, seize, or
19	hold order for any food suspected of being the cause of a food
20	borne illness.
21	"(e) The department shall promulgate rules requiring
22	$\frac{1}{2}$ A cottage food production operation $\frac{1}{2}$ shall label all $\frac{1}{2}$
23	goods, canned jams or jellies, candies, and dried herb or herb
24	$\frac{\text{mix}}{\text{cottage foods}}$ that the operation sells to consumers, and

requiring completion of shall complete a food safety course

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1	approved by the department. The label shall include in at
2	least size 10-point font the common or usual name of the food,
3	the name, and home or P.O. Box address of the cottage food
4	production operation, and a statement that the food is not
5	inspected by the department or local health department. $\underline{\text{The}}$
6	label shall also contain a list of the ingredients in the food
7	in descending order of predominance and shall include a
8	disclaimer that the food may contain allergens. The operator
9	of a cottage food production operation, shall maintain
10	certification of having attended and passed a food safety
11	course approved by the department.
12	"(f) A cottage food production operation may not
13	sell baked goods, jams and jellies, candies, or dried herbs
14	and herb mixes over the Internet."
15	Section 2. This act shall become effective on the

first day of the third month following its passage and

approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
