18	Section 1. Section 14-1-1.5, Code of Alabama 1975,

21	"(a) The commissioner shall have the authority to	
22	$\underline{\text{may}}$ appoint no more than three deputy commissioners, who shall	
23	serve at his <u>or her</u> pleasure, and to <u>the commissioner shall</u>

"(b) One deputy commissioner shall be known as the

Deputy Commissioner for Prisoner Rehabilitation. The Deputy

Commissioner for Prisoner Rehabilitation shall be responsible for the development, implementation, and improvement of programs designed to reduce recidivism."

Section 2. One executive-level employee at the Department of Pardons and Paroles, or its successor agency, shall be known as the Deputy Director for Parolee Rehabilitation. The Deputy Director for Parolee Rehabilitation shall be responsible for the development, implementation, and improvement of programs designed to reduce recidivism.

Section 3. (a) There is established a Study

Commission on Interagency Cooperation and Collaboration on the

Rehabilitation and Reintegration of Formerly Incarcerated

Individuals, which shall consist of all of the following:

- (1) One member of the House of Representatives, appointed by the Speaker of the House.
- (2) One member of the Senate, appointed by the President Pro Tempore.
- (3) The Director of Pardons and Paroles, or his or her designee.

(4) The Commissioner of the Department of 1 2 Corrections, or his or her designee. (5) The Commissioner of the Department of Mental 3 Health, or his or her designee. 4 5 (6) The Director of the Department of Human Resources, or his or her designee. 6 (7) The Commissioner of the Alabama Medicaid Agency, 8 or his or her designee. (8) The Director of the Alabama Community College 9 10 System, or his or her designee. (9) The Secretary of the Alabama State Law 11 12 Enforcement Agency, or his or her designee. 13 (10) The Secretary of the Department of Labor, or 14 his or her designee. 15 (11) The Commissioner of the Alabama Department of 16 Veterans Affairs, or his or her designee. 17 (b) The Director of Pardons and Paroles, or his or 18 her designee, shall serve as the chair of the commission. A vice chair shall be designated by a majority vote of the 19 2.0 quorum of the membership at its first meeting. A quorum shall 21 consist of a majority of the membership. 22 (c) The membership of the commission shall be 23 inclusive and reflect the racial, gender, geographic, 24 urban/rural, and economic diversity of the state.

(d) The commission shall have all of the following

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duties:

(1) Develop and present a strategic plan to make

communities safer by reducing recidivism and victimization and

assist individuals who return from prison to become productive

citizens and save taxpayer dollars by lowering the direct and

collateral costs of incarceration.

- (2) Identify, implement, and promote evidence-based research, policies, strategies, and programming to support successful reentry and reintegration.
- (3) Promote partnerships and collaboration among state agencies and with local governments and organizations to effectively and cost-efficiently advance reentry and reintegration efforts and eliminate duplication of services.
- (4) Develop strategies to expand access to educational programs and support programs upon reentry.
- (5) Develop strategies to assure access to health care coverage and behavioral health services upon reentry.
- (6) Identify and address unwarranted barriers to successful reentry.
- (e) (1) The commission shall hold its first meeting no later than June 1, 2021, with the date, time, and location of the meeting to be designated by the Director of Pardons and Paroles, or his or her designee.
- (2) At the first meeting, the commission shall elect a vice chair, elect other officers as determined by the commission, and set dates, times, and locations of subsequent meetings.

- (3) The commission shall meet at least monthly and 1 2 shall report its findings, conclusions, and recommendations to the Legislature no later than the fifth legislative day of the 3 4 2022 Regular Session, whereupon the commission shall stand 5 dissolved and discharged of any further duties and liabilities.
- 7 (f) The House of Representatives and the Senate shall provide the necessary staff and support to the 8 commission to perform its duties. 9

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- (q) Members of the commission shall serve without compensation, but may be reimbursed for necessary expenses in attending meetings of the commission according to policies and procedures of their respective appointing authority or employing agency.
- (h) Legislative members of the commission shall be entitled to their legislative compensation, per diem, and travel expenses for each day they attend a meeting of the commission, in accordance with Amendment 871 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901.

2.0 Section 4. This act shall become effective 21 immediately following its passage and approval by the 22 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
