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8	SYNOPSIS:	Under existing law, upon receiving dicennial
9		census redistricting data from the U.S. Census
10		Bureau, the Legislature must redraw Congressional
11		districts and state legislative districts and pass
12		redistricting legislation. By federal law, the U.S.
13		Census Bureau is required to send redistricting
14		data to the states by April 1, 2021; however, the
15		U.S. Census Bureau announced that it will not be
16		sending this redistricting data to states until
17		September 30, 2021. After that date, the
18		Legislature must pass redistricting legislation.
19		This delayed date will affect the election cycle
20		for the 2022 general election.
21		Under existing law, primary elections,
22		except in years when there is a presidential
23		primary, are held on the fourth Tuesday in May and
24		primary runoff elections are held four weeks later.
25		This bill would provide that only during the
26		2022 election cycle, the primary election shall be

held on the second Tuesday in July.

16	law to the contrary, the primary election shall be held on the	
17	second Tuesday in July.	
18	Section 2. This act shall become effective	
19	immediately following its passage and approval by the	
20	Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
