14	(a) The purpose of the Study Commission on Pre-Trial
15	Services and Alternative Courts is to study the process of
16	gaining entrance into pre-trial diversion or alternative
17	courts and to seek methods for making these services more
18	uniform and accessible to all Alabamians. The commission shall
19	consider the entrance cost to programs, indigency
20	availability, effectiveness of services rendered, and program
21	uniformity.
22	(b) The Study Commission on Pre-Trial Services and
23	Alternative Courts shall be comprised of the following
24	members:
25	(1) The Executive Director of the Alabama Sentencing
26	Commission, who shall serve as Chair of the Commission.

- (2) Two members of the House of Representatives 1 2 appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives. (3) Two members of the Senate appointed by the 3 President Pro Tempore of the Senate. 4 5 (4) One member appointed by the Senate Minority Leader. 6 (5) One member appointed by the House Minority 8 Leader. (6) A circuit court judge appointed by the President 9 10 of the Circuit Court Judges' Association. (7) A circuit court judge appointed by the Alabama 11 12 Supreme Court. 13 (8) A district attorney appointed by the Alabama District Attorneys Association. 14 15 (9) The Executive Director of the Alabama Office of Prosecution Services. 16 17 (10) A practicing attorney appointed by the Alabama 18 Bar Association. (11) A representative of a legal research 19 2.0 organization appointed by the President of the Circuit Court 21 Judges' Association. (12) A representative of a legal research 2.2 23 organization appointed by the Executive Director of the 24 Alabama Office of Prosecution Services.
- 25 (13) A representative of the Association of County 26 Commissions of Alabama.

1 (c) All appointing authorities shall coordinate
2 their appointments to assure the commission is inclusive and
3 reflects the racial, gender, geographical, urban, rural, and
4 economic diversity of this state.

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- (d) The study commission shall meet as needed at the call of the chair.
- (e) Each member shall serve at the pleasure of his or her appointing authority. A vacancy in the membership shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointment.
- (f) Members of the commission shall serve without compensation but may be reimbursed for expenses as follows:
- (1) The legislative members of the study commission shall be entitled to their legislative compensation, per diem, and travel expenses for each day they attend a meeting of the study commission, in accordance with Amendment 871 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901.
- (2) Other members of the commission may be reimbursed for necessary expenses in attending meetings of the commission according to policies and procedures of their respective appointing authority.
- (g) A majority of the members of the study commission shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of all business at a regular or special meeting.
- (h) The study commission shall hold its initial meeting no later than September 1, 2021. Each appointment made shall be indicated to the Executive Director of the Alabama

Sentencing Commission no later than the first day of the third month following the Governor's signature of the resolution.

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(i) The study commission shall submit a report of its findings and recommendations to the Senate President Pro Tempore and the Speaker of the House of Representatives on or before the first day of the 2022 Legislative Session, at which time it shall be dissolved.
