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3 SUBSTITUTE FOR HB2 (Daniels House Plan 1)  
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8 SYNOPSIS: Sections 199 and 200 of the Constitution of  
9 Alabama of 1901, require the Legislature to  
10 redistrict and reapportion the Alabama Senate and  
11 the House of Representatives following the release  
12 of each federal decennial census.

13 This bill would divide the state into  
14 districts for the purpose of electing members of  
15 the Alabama House of Representatives until the next  
16 federal census is released.

20 AN ACT

22 To provide for the reapportionment and redistricting  
23 of the state into districts for the purpose of electing the  
24 members of the Alabama House of Representatives until the  
25 release of the next federal census; and to repeal and reenact  
26 Section 29-1-1.2, Code of Alabama 1975, relating to the House  
27 districts.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

2 Section 1. Section 29-1-1.2, Code of Alabama 1975,  
3 relating to the existing House districts, is repealed.

4 Section 2. Section 29-1-1.2 is added to the Code of  
5 Alabama 1975, to read as follows:

6 §29-1-1.2.

7 (a) The Alabama House of Representatives shall  
8 consist of 105 members. Each member elected shall reside in  
9 the district which he or she represents or seeks to represent.  
10 The State of Alabama is divided into 105 House Districts as  
11 provided in subsection (b).

12 (b) The numbers and boundaries of the districts are  
13 designated and established by the map prepared by the  
14 Permanent Legislative Committee on Reapportionment and  
15 identified and labeled as Daniels House Plan 1, including the  
16 corresponding boundary description provided by the census  
17 tracts, blocks, and counties, and are incorporated by  
18 reference as part of this section.

19 (c) The Legislature shall post for viewing on its  
20 public website the map referenced in subsection (b), including  
21 the corresponding boundary description provided by the census  
22 tracts, blocks, and counties, and any alternative map,  
23 including the corresponding boundary description provided by  
24 the census tracts, blocks, and counties, introduced by any  
25 member of the Legislature during the legislative session in  
26 which this section is added or amended.

1           (d) Upon enactment of the act adding this section  
2 and adopting the map identified in subsection (b), the Clerk  
3 of the House of Representatives shall transmit the map and the  
4 corresponding boundary description provided by the census  
5 tracts, blocks, and counties identified in subsection (b) for  
6 certification and posting on the public website of the  
7 Secretary of State.

8           (e) The boundary descriptions provided by the  
9 certified map referenced in subsection (b) shall prevail over  
10 the boundary descriptions provided by the census tracts,  
11 blocks, and counties generated for the map.

12           Section 3. The provisions of this act are severable.  
13 If any part of this act is declared invalid or  
14 unconstitutional, that declaration shall not affect the part  
15 which remains.

16           Section 4. This act shall become effective  
17 immediately upon its passage and approval by the Governor, or  
18 upon its otherwise becoming a law.
