1 Relating to COVID-19 vaccinations; to provide that a 2 minor may not receive a COVID-19 vaccine without parental 3 consent; to prohibit an institution of education from 4 inquiring about a minor student's vaccination status without 5 parental consent; to provide for enforcement by the Attorney 6 General; and to define terms.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

8 Section 1. (a) As used in this section, the terms 9 "vaccination" and "vaccine" mean any injection intended to 10 prevent the spread of COVID-19 or minimize the effects of 11 COVID-19, irrespective of whether or not the injection meets 12 the classical definition of vaccine.

(b) Notwithstanding Section 22-8-4, Code of Alabama
14 1975, no minor may receive a vaccination without the written
15 consent of the minor's parent or, if applicable, legal
16 guardian.

(c) Institutions of education may not inquire into the vaccination status of a minor student without the written consent of the minor's parent or, if applicable, the legal guardian.

(d) The Attorney General may commence a civil action
to enjoin a threatened or continuing violation of this section
or Section 1 of Act 2021-493, now appearing as Section
22-11B-5, Code of Alabama 1975.

25 Section 2. This act shall become effective 26 immediately following its passage and approval by the 27 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
