24 passports, vaccine or immunization passes, or any other
25 standardized documentation for the purpose of certifying the
26 immunization status of an individual, or otherwise require the
27 publication or sharing of immunization records or similar

1 health information for an individual, except as otherwise
2 required by Chapter 30 of Title 16, or other applicable state
3 law.

4 "(b) A state or local government entity or agency,
5 or any of its officers or agents, may not require an
6 individual to receive an immunization or present documentation
7 of an immunization as a condition for receiving any government
8 service or for entry into a government building, except as
9 otherwise required by Chapter 30 of Title 16, or other
10 applicable state law.

11 "(c) Institutions of education may continue to
12 require a student to prove vaccination status as a condition
13 of attendance only for the specific vaccines that were already
14 required by the institution as of January 1, 2021, provided
15 that the institutions give an exemption for students with a
16 medical condition or religious belief that is contrary to
17 vaccination.

18 "(d) An entity or individual doing business in this
19 state may not refuse to provide any goods or services, or
20 refuse to allow admission, to a customer based on
21 the customer's immunization status or lack of documentation
22 that the customer has received an immunization. As used in
23 this subsection, the term "immunization" means any injection
24 intended to prevent the spread of COVID-19 or minimize the
25 effects of COVID-19, irrespective of whether or not the
26 injection meets the classical definition of vaccine."
