8 SYNOPSIS: This bill would provide that no minor may
9 receive a vaccine for COVID-19 without parental
10 consent.

11 Under existing law, a minor age 14 years of
12 age or older may consent to medical treatment for
13 himself or herself.

14 This bill would prohibit an institution of
15 education from inquiring about a student's COVID-19
16 vaccination status without parental consent.

17 This bill would authorize the Attorney
18 General to pursue civil actions to enjoin a
19 threatened or continuing violation of this act.

21 A BILL

22 TO BE ENTITLED

23 AN ACT

25 Relating to COVID-19 vaccinations; to provide that a
26 minor may not receive a COVID-19 vaccine without parental
27 consent; to prohibit an institution of education from

1 inquiring about a minor student's vaccination status without
2 parental consent; and to provide for enforcement by the
3 Attorney General.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

5 Section 1. (a) As used in this section, the terms
6 "vaccination" and "vaccine" mean any injection intended to
7 prevent the spread of COVID-19 or minimize the effects of
8 COVID-19, irrespective of whether or not the injection meets
9 the classical definition of vaccine.

10 (b) Notwithstanding Section 22-8-4, Code of Alabama
11 1975, no minor may receive a vaccination without the written
12 consent of the minor's parent or, if applicable, legal
13 guardian.

14 (c) Institutions of education may not inquire into
15 the vaccination status of a minor student without the written
16 consent of the minor's parent or, if applicable, the legal
17 guardian.

18 (d) The Attorney General may commence a civil action
19 to enjoin a threatened or continuing violation of this
20 section.

21 Section 2. This act shall become effective
22 immediately following its passage and approval by the
23 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
