1 AN ACT

Relating to vaccination mandates; to prohibit an employer from mandating vaccinations for COVID-19 unless explicitly mandated by federal law; to require employers to offer employees alternatives to vaccinations in the work place; to provide an exemption from vaccinations for medical reasons or because of religious beliefs; to provide that a minor may not receive a required vaccine without parental consent; and to define terms.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. (a) As used in this section, the terms "vaccination" and "vaccine" include any injection intended to prevent the spread of COVID-19 or minimize the effects of COVID-19, irrespective of whether or not the injection meets the classical definition of vaccine.

(b) Unless explicitly federally mandated to do so, no employer may require an employee to receive a vaccine. When implementing any federal mandate, an employer shall offer employees a broad range of reasonable measures, other than vaccinations, to minimize the spread of COVID-19, unless vaccinations are explicitly required by federal law or regulation. Such measures may include, but are not limited to, requiring periodic testing, masks, or social distancing, or proving the presence of natural antibodies.

Section 2. No individual, resident, or employee shall be required to receive a vaccine, including a vaccine as

- defined in Section 1, if the vaccine is medically 1 2 contraindicated or if the administration of the vaccine is against the individual's religious beliefs. 3 Section 3. Notwithstanding Section 22-8-4, Code of 4 5 Alabama 1975, no minor shall be required to receive a vaccine, as defined in Section 1, without the written consent of a 6 7 parent or, if applicable, legal guardian. Section 4. For purpose of attendance in any institution of education, whether public or private, no 9 10 student shall be required to receive a vaccine, as defined in Section 1, if the vaccine is medically contraindicated or if 11
