WHEREAS, Mr. Fuller, who was known as the "Political King Maker," had a true passion for service to his community and was an active leader in numerous civic, professional, and political organizations and causes; he served for two terms as President of the Birmingham Jaycees, two terms as President of the City Sales Club, two terms as President of the Mid-Alabama Republican Club, and two terms as Chairman of the Birmingham Regional Chamber of Commerce; some of his other achievements included serving as Chairman of the Jefferson County March of Dimes Walk-A-Thon; State and National Director for the Alabama Independent Insurance Agents Association; Past President of Professional Insurance Agents of Alabama; Chairman of the Corridor X Task Force, where he spearheaded the development and completion of the Memphis to Birmingham interstate, now known as I-22; having a bridge along the route at the Jefferson-Walker County line named in his honor by the Alabama Legislature; and being named President Emeritus for his 44 years of service to the Birmingham City Sales Club, receiving the Alabama Independent Insurance Agents Insuror of the Year Award in 2014 and having the Joe E. "Hawk" Fuller Lawmaker of the Year Award/The Hawk Award, an award that is bestowed annually in perpetuity to a deserving legislator, created in
