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2 To make supplemental appropriations for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2022: from the Alabama Board of 3 Examiners in Counseling Fund to the Alabama Board of Examiners 4 5 in Counseling in the amount of \$222,465; from the Alabama Board of Examiners of Assisted Living Administrators Fund to the Alabama Board of Examiners of Assisted Living Administrators in the amount of \$30,000; from the State 9 General Fund to various agencies and entities a total amount 10 of \$119,305,398; and to amend Section 2C of Act 2021-479, the General Fund Appropriations Act for the fiscal year ending 11 September 30, 2022, to clarify the intent regarding an 12 13 appropriation to the Department of Commerce.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. In addition to all other appropriations heretofore or hereafter made, there is hereby appropriated \$222,465 from the Alabama Board of Examiners in Counseling Fund to the Alabama Board of Examiners in Counseling for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2022.

Section 2. In addition to all other appropriations heretofore or hereafter made, there is hereby appropriated \$30,000 from the Alabama Board of Examiners of Assisted Living Administrators Fund to the Alabama Board of Examiners of Assisted Living Administrators for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2022.

Section 3. In addition to all other appropriations heretofore or hereafter made, there is hereby appropriated a

total of \$119,305,398 from the State General Fund to the following agencies and entities for the purposes specified below for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2022:

- (1) To the Legislature, \$362,611. Of this amount, \$100,000 shall be used for reapportionment litigation expenses, and \$262,611 shall be used for special session expenses.
- Authority (ACIFA) Program within Debt Service, \$30,000,000. This appropriation to the ACIFA is conditioned upon ACIFA being required to make a debt service payment during fiscal year 2022 on bonds issued pursuant to the authorization granted by Act 2021-546. Any of the above appropriation that is not needed to make a debt service payment during fiscal year 2022 on bonds issued pursuant to the authorization granted by Act 2021-546 is hereby appropriated to the Alabama Trust Fund Board of Trustees to be credited as a repayment pursuant to Section 29-10-1, Code of Alabama 1975.
- (3) To the District Attorneys for one-time expenses for the Certified Victim Service Officer/Certified Facility Dog (CVSO/CFD) Program, \$1,500,000.
- (4) To the Bureau of Pardons and Paroles, \$2,995,111.
  - (5) To the Department of Economic and Community
    Affairs, \$3,500,000. Of this amount, \$500,000 shall be used
    for emergency sanitary sewer repairs in the City of Brewton;
    \$500,000 shall be used for an economic development project in

- 2 Anniston Airport; and \$500,000 shall be used for a survey and
- 3 evaluation of dams in Alabama.

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- 4 (6) To the Educational Television Commission for one-time capital outlay expenses, \$500,000.
- 6 (7) To the Department of Forensic Sciences for a 7 forensic laboratory in Dothan, \$5,300,000.
- 8 (8) To the Department of Human Resources to be used 9 to complete the development of a new system for SNAP and TANF, 10 \$5,587,531.
  - (9) To the Department of Veterans Affairs for the construction of the Command Sergeant Major Bennie Adkins State Veterans Home, \$6,000,000.
- 14 (10) To the Department of Agriculture and
  15 Industries, \$9,500,000. Of this amount, \$7,000,000 shall be
  16 used to construct a new laboratory facility, and \$2,500,000
  17 shall be used for rural utility infrastructure.
- (11) To the State Law Enforcement Agency, \$7,043,500. Of this amount, \$1,000,000 shall be used to repair hurricane damage to the Orange Beach Marine Patrol facility and \$6,043,500 shall be used for radio and communications improvements.
- 23 (12) To the Department of Senior Services to be used 24 to open an elder abuse shelter, \$1,000,000.
- 25 (13) To the Alabama Medical Cannabis Commission, 26 \$3,500,000.

- 1 (14) To the Department of Mental Health for a crisis 2 residential unit for civilly committed individuals in Region 3 1, \$700,000.
- 4 (15) To the Alabama Department of Tourism,
  5 \$3,000,000. Of this amount, \$2,700,000 shall be expended for
  6 the World Games, and \$300,000 shall be expended for the
  7 Birmingham Convention and Visitor's Bureau.

- (16) To the Department of Environmental Management, \$7,377,000. Of this amount, \$1,500,000 shall be used for the Coastal Program building at the Mobile Field Office, and \$5,877,000 shall be used for state matching funds required for the Clean Water and Drinking Water State Revolving Loan Funds under the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act of 2021.
- (17) To the Alabama Forestry Commission, \$3,500,000. Of this amount, \$1,500,000 shall be used to procure and maintain vehicles and equipment used for preventing and fighting forest fires, and \$2,000,000 shall be used for an operational training center.
- (18) To the Alabama Historical Commission, \$1,500,000. Of this amount, \$500,000 shall be used for an Alabama ecotourism study; \$500,000 shall be used for the Alabama Veterans Museum and Archives; and \$500,000 shall be used for Fort Morgan.
- (19) To the General Fund Budget Reserve Fund to reach the maximum allocation pursuant to Section 29-13-4, Code of Alabama 1975, \$24,696,745.

1 (20) To the Department of Public Health for Kick 2 COVID, \$162,900. (21) To the Office of Prosecution Services for 3 one-time expenses for the Certified Victim Service 5 Officer/Certified Facility Dog (CVSO/CFD) Program, \$1,500,000. 6 (22) To the Alabama Department of Labor for 7 reimbursement of expenses related to Act 2021-561, \$80,000. Section 4. Section 2C of Act 2021-479, the General 9 Fund Appropriations Act for the fiscal year ending September 10 30, 2022, is hereby amended as follows: "24. Commerce, Department of: 11 12 (a) Industrial Development Program.... 13 Of the above appropriation, \$75,000 shall be 14 expended for the Robotics Technology Park. Of the above 15 appropriation, \$1,200,000 shall be expended for one-time costs 16 for the acquisition of property for an for economic 17 development project projects by the Washington County 18 Commission and Economic Development Authority. These funds shall not be released until a letter of intent to purchase the 19 20 property is upon written request provided to the Secretary of 21 Commerce by the Chair of the County Commission and Executive 22 Director of the Economic Development Authority by the County Commission." 23 24 Section 5.
