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2 To make supplemental appropriations for the fiscal

14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

15 Section 1. In addition to all other appropriations
16 heretofore or hereafter made, there is hereby appropriated
17 \$222,465 from the Alabama Board of Examiners in Counseling
18 Fund to the Alabama Board of Examiners in Counseling for the
19 fiscal year ending September 30, 2022.

20 Section 2. In addition to all other appropriations
21 heretofore or hereafter made, there is hereby appropriated
22 \$30,000 from the Alabama Board of Examiners of Assisted Living
23 Administrators Fund to the Alabama Board of Examiners of
24 Assisted Living Administrators for the fiscal year ending
25 September 30, 2022.

26 Section 3. In addition to all other appropriations
27 heretofore or hereafter made, there is hereby appropriated a

1 total of \$119,305,398 from the State General Fund to the
2 following agencies and entities for the purposes specified
3 below for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2022:

4 (1) To the Legislature, \$362,611. Of this amount,
5 \$100,000 shall be used for reapportionment litigation
6 expenses, and \$262,611 shall be used for special session
7 expenses.

8 (2) To the Alabama Corrections Institution Finance
9 Authority (ACIFA) Program within Debt Service, \$30,000,000.
10 This appropriation to the ACIFA is conditioned upon ACIFA
11 being required to make a debt service payment during fiscal
12 year 2022 on bonds issued pursuant to the authorization
13 granted by Act 2021-546. Any of the above appropriation that
14 is not needed to make a debt service payment during fiscal
15 year 2022 on bonds issued pursuant to the authorization
16 granted by Act 2021-546 is hereby appropriated to the Alabama
17 Trust Fund Board of Trustees to be credited as a repayment
18 pursuant to Section 29-10-1, Code of Alabama 1975.

19 (3) To the District Attorneys for one-time expenses
20 for the Certified Victim Service Officer/Certified Facility
21 Dog (CVSO/CFD) Program, \$1,500,000.

22 (4) To the Bureau of Pardons and Paroles,
23 \$2,995,111.

24 (5) To the Department of Economic and Community
25 Affairs, \$3,500,000. Of this amount, \$500,000 shall be used
26 for emergency sanitary sewer repairs in the City of Brewton;
27 \$500,000 shall be used for an economic development project in

1 Crenshaw County; \$2,000,000 shall be used for renovations at
2 Anniston Airport; and \$500,000 shall be used for a survey and
3 evaluation of dams in Alabama.

4 (6) To the Educational Television Commission for
5 one-time capital outlay expenses, \$500,000.

6 (7) To the Department of Forensic Sciences for a
7 forensic laboratory in Dothan, \$5,300,000.

8 (8) To the Department of Human Resources to be used
9 to complete the development of a new system for SNAP and TANF,
10 \$5,587,531.

11 (9) To the Department of Veterans Affairs for the
12 construction of the Command Sergeant Major Bennie Adkins State
13 Veterans Home, \$6,000,000.

14 (10) To the Department of Agriculture and
15 Industries, \$9,500,000. Of this amount, \$7,000,000 shall be
16 used to construct a new laboratory facility, and \$2,500,000
17 shall be used for rural utility infrastructure.

18 (11) To the State Law Enforcement Agency,
19 \$7,043,500. Of this amount, \$1,000,000 shall be used to repair
20 hurricane damage to the Orange Beach Marine Patrol facility
21 and \$6,043,500 shall be used for radio and communications
22 improvements.

23 (12) To the Department of Senior Services to be used
24 to open an elder abuse shelter, \$1,000,000.

25 (13) To the Alabama Medical Cannabis Commission,
26 \$3,500,000.

1 (14) To the Department of Mental Health for a crisis
2 residential unit for civilly committed individuals in Region
3 1, \$700,000.

4 (15) To the Alabama Department of Tourism,
5 \$3,000,000. Of this amount, \$2,700,000 shall be expended for
6 the World Games, and \$300,000 shall be expended for the
7 Birmingham Convention and Visitor's Bureau.

8 (16) To the Department of Environmental Management,
9 \$7,377,000. Of this amount, \$1,500,000 shall be used for the
10 Coastal Program building at the Mobile Field Office, and
11 \$5,877,000 shall be used for state matching funds required for
12 the Clean Water and Drinking Water State Revolving Loan Funds
13 under the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act of 2021.

14 (17) To the Alabama Forestry Commission, \$3,500,000.
15 Of this amount, \$1,500,000 shall be used to procure and
16 maintain vehicles and equipment used for preventing and
17 fighting forest fires, and \$2,000,000 shall be used for an
18 operational training center.

19 (18) To the Alabama Historical Commission,
20 \$1,500,000. Of this amount, \$500,000 shall be used for an
21 Alabama ecotourism study; \$500,000 shall be used for the
22 Alabama Veterans Museum and Archives; and \$500,000 shall be
23 used for Fort Morgan.

24 (19) To the General Fund Budget Reserve Fund to
25 reach the maximum allocation pursuant to Section 29-13-4, Code
26 of Alabama 1975, \$24,696,745.

1 (20) To the Department of Public Health for Kick
2 COVID, \$162,900.

3 (21) To the Office of Prosecution Services for
4 one-time expenses for the Certified Victim Service
5 Officer/Certified Facility Dog (CVSO/CFD) Program, \$1,500,000.

6 (22) To the Alabama Department of Labor for
7 reimbursement of expenses related to Act 2021-561, \$80,000.

8 Section 4. Section 2C of Act 2021-479, the General
9 Fund Appropriations Act for the fiscal year ending September
10 30, 2022, is hereby amended as follows:

11 "24. Commerce, Department of:

12 (a) Industrial Development Program....

13 Of the above appropriation, \$75,000 shall be
14 expended for the Robotics Technology Park. Of the above
15 appropriation, \$1,200,000 shall be expended for one-time costs
16 ~~for the acquisition of property for an~~ for economic
