18	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
19	Section 1. (a) As used in this section, the
20	following terms shall have the following meanings:
21	(1) CAR. Every vehicle that is self-propelled and
22	used for transportation of persons, except for electric
23	personal assistive mobility devices.
24	(2) CAR SHARING. The authorized use of a shared car
25	by persons other than the shared car's owner, facilitated by a
26	car sharing program.

1 (3) CAR SHARING AGREEMENT. The terms and conditions
2 that apply to a shared car owner and a shared car driver and
3 that govern the use of a shared car.

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- (4) CAR SHARING PROGRAM. A person that is in the business of operating an online platform to connect third-party car owners with third-party car drivers to enable peer-to-peer car sharing within the state. The term does not include the registered owner of a car involved in car sharing facilitated by a car sharing program.
- (5) SHARED CAR. A car that is available for sharing through a car sharing program.
- (6) SHARED CAR DRIVER. An individual who has been authorized to drive a shared car by a car sharing program under a car sharing agreement.
- (7) SHARED CAR OWNER. A person that makes a shared car available for sharing to shared car drivers through a car sharing program.
- (b) A car sharing program that enables car sharing at an airport shall be deemed to be an off-site concessionaire operating at the airport and shall enter into a concession agreement with the airport authority before enabling car sharing, as provided in subsection (c), at the airport. The concession agreement required by this subsection shall contain the same or reasonably similar terms, conditions, standards, regulations, procedures, fees, and access requirements applicable to off-site rental car companies operating at the airport. Airport authorities may adopt rules for car sharing

programs and impose fees on car sharing programs that enable car sharing at an airport.

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- (c) A car sharing program enables car sharing at an airport if the car sharing program or a shared car owner uses the car sharing program to do any of the following:
- (1) List cars parked on airport property or at airport facilities.
- (2) Contract for transportation to or from airport facilities.
 - (3) Facilitate the use of a shared car to transport airport passengers on or off of airport property.
 - (4) Promote or market a shared car to transport airport passengers on or off of airport property.
- (d) A car sharing program shall collect and verify records concerning the use of a car, including times used, fees paid by the shared car driver, and revenues received by the shared car owner. A car sharing program shall provide these records upon request to the airport authority as required by a concession agreement. The car sharing program shall retain these records for at least three years.
- (e) If a car sharing program violates this section, the airport authority shall be entitled to an injunction prohibiting further violations of this section, actual damages, punitive damages, and reasonable attorneys' fees and costs.

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
