18	Relating to state designations; to designate the
19	22nd day of January of each year as the Day of Tears.
20	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
21	Section 1. (a) The Legislature hereby finds and
22	declares all of the following:
23	(1) On January 22, 1973, a majority of the members
24	of the United States Supreme Court ruled that access to
25	abortion was a right secured by the Constitution.

(2) Since that fateful day, over 61 million unborn
children have perished, amounting to an entire third of
Generations X through Alpha.

(3) As inscribed into the constitution of this state 4 5 by Amendment 930 to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Section 36.06 of the Official Recompilation of 6 7 the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, it is the 8 public policy of this state to recognize and support the 9 sanctity of unborn life and the rights of unborn children, 10 most importantly the right to life in all manners and measures appropriate and lawful; and that the constitution of this 11 12 state does not protect the right to abortion or require the 13 funding of abortion.

(b) The 22nd day of January of each year is designated as the Day of Tears in this state, and the offices of all state, county, and local governments shall lower their national and state flags to half-staff to mourn the innocents who have lost their lives to abortion. Residents of Alabama are encouraged to similarly lower their flags to half-staff.

20 Section 2. This act shall become effective 21 immediately following its passage and approval by the 22 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
