20	Relating to a state income tax; to provide an annual
21	state income tax credit to a qualified volunteer firefighter
22	or a qualified member of an organized rescue squad who meets
23	certain criteria as a volunteer firefighter or an emergency
24	medical technician or paramedic who obtains certain approved
25	training each year.
26	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

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Section 1. For the purposes of this act, the
 following words shall have the following meanings:

(1) QUALIFIED RESCUE SQUAD MEMBER. A member of an
organized rescue squad of a city, town, county, or other
subdivision of the state or a public corporation and a member
of the Alabama Association of Rescue Squads who is licensed by
the Alabama Department of Public Health as an Emergency
Medical Services Provider.

9 (2) QUALIFIED VOLUNTEER FIREFIGHTER. A volunteer 10 firefighter who is a member of a volunteer fire department as 11 recognized by the State Forestry Commission, and certified as 12 by the Alabama Firefighter's Personnel Standards and Education 13 Commission as a firefighter or licensed by the Alabama 14 Department of Public Health as an Emergency Medical Services 15 Provider.

16 Section 2. (a) A qualified volunteer firefighter who 17 is certified as a FireFighter I or a licensed EMT-Basic, or a 18 qualified rescue squad member who is a licensed EMT-Basic, 19 shall be entitled to a state income tax credit in the amount 20 of three hundred dollars (\$300) each year if he or she submits 21 proof of training meeting the requirements of subsection (c).

(b) A qualified firefighter who is certified as a
Firefighter II or a licensed Advanced EMT or EMT-Paremedic, or
a qualified rescue squad member who is a licensed Advanced EMT
or EMT-Paramedic, shall be entitled to a state income tax
credit of six hundred dollars (\$600) each year if he or she

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submits proof of training meeting the requirements of subsection (c).

3 (c) (1) The member of a volunteer fire department
4 certified by the State Forestry Commission, including a
5 combination fire department, or organized rescue squad
6 claiming an income tax credit under this section shall submit
7 proof of not less than 30 hours of training each year.

8 (2) In order to qualify as training hours for 9 purposes of this section, the training hours shall be obtained 10 by either of the following:

a. Participation in organized training in a class
approved for use in the fire service or emergency medical
services in providing service as a firefighter.

b. Participation in organized training in a class
approved for use in rescue squad and emergency medical
services in providing service as a rescue squad member.

17 (3) Training hours shall be certified for the 18 purposes of this act if the training hours are approved in 19 advance of the training by the volunteer fire department or 20 the organized rescue squad that the person receiving the 21 training is a member of.

(d) The Department of Revenue shall adopt rules toimplement this act.

24 Section 3. This act shall become effective on the 25 first day of the third month following its passage and 26 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.

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
