disabled or deceased veteran or otherwise eligible for 1 2 educational benefits under this chapter who is admitted to attend and attends a comprehensive transition and 3 postsecondary program for students with intellectual 4 5 disabilities at a state four-year <del>college or university</del> institution of higher education shall be eligible to receive 6 7 benefits equal to the benefits provided pursuant to this 8 chapter to any other child eligible for educational benefits 9 in an undergraduate course of study at a state four-year 10 college or university institution of higher education under this chapter without regard as to whether the program is a 11 12 degree, certificate, or non-degree program.

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"(a) Any child whose father or mother:

15 "(c) For those first filing for benefits under this chapter on or after July 31, 2017, and for those attending a 16 qualifying private school, the educational benefit shall be 17 18 for tuition reimbursement and books and fees reimbursement. The value of tuition paid per semester hour (or equivalent) 19 20 shall be limited to the rate of the Department of Defense 21 Tuition Assistance Cap. The value of the books and fees paid per semester shall be limited to one thousand dollars (\$1,000) 22 23 per student.

"(d) For the purpose of the minimum disability

of any veteran whose disability rating as of July 31, 2017, is

the benefits of this chapter, provided that the dependent shall file application for such benefits before July 31, 2023, and the dependent is reasonably expected to be eligible to attend an Alabama institution of higher learning, college, or <u>university a qualifying school</u> in the next academic year.  8 or widower whose spouse, during their marriage:

This section shall not apply to the spouse of any such deceased serviceman or veteran who has 3 remarried prior to applying for and obtaining educational 4 5 benefits under this section, and should any such spouse of such the deceased serviceman or veteran remarry during the 6 7 time he or she is in attendance upon any of the qualifying 8 schools, colleges, or universities mentioned in this section, 9 then he or she shall pay tuition and fees for the course of 10 study or attendance upon such the qualifying school, college, or university from the time of the remarriage. The benefits 11 provided under this section shall be in addition to federal 12 13 government benefits.

14 "(b) Except as provided in Section 31-6-11(e), the 15 The educational benefits provided by this section to wives, 16 husbands, and unmarried spouses and widows or widowers making 17 application for benefits for the first time beginning with the 18 fall term of the 2014-2015 academic year, and thereafter, shall be limited to undergraduate courses of study only, and 19 20 the value of tuition paid shall be limited to the in-state 21 tuition rate of the Alabama state-supported college or university qualifying school attended. 22

"(c) For those first filing for benefits under this
chapter on or after July 31, 2017, <u>and for those attending a</u>
<u>qualifying private school</u>, the educational benefit shall be
for tuition reimbursement and books and fees reimbursement.
The value of tuition paid per semester hour (or equivalent)

shall be limited to the rate of the Department of Defense
 Tuition Assistance Cap. The value of the books and fees paid
 per semester shall be limited to \$1,000 one thousand dollars
 (\$1,000) per student.

"(a) The spouse and children of any veteran who is 6 7 suffering from 40 to 90 percent service-connected disability 8 brought about from service in the Armed Forces of the United 9 States, or the unmarried widow or widower and children of a 10 deceased veteran who was suffering from 40 percent or more of service-connected disability at the time of death, provided 11 12 such disabilities as are mentioned herein are incurred from 13 military service, as established by the State Department of Veterans' Affairs, shall be entitled to the following 14 educational advantages and opportunities: 15

16 "(1) The spouse or unmarried widow or widower, as 17 the case may be, shall be entitled to up to 27 months of 18 schooling, or the equivalent of 27 months if enrolled 19 part-time, in any Alabama state-supported institution of 20 higher learning, college, or university, or to a prescribed 21 course in any Alabama state-supported community or technical college qualifying school, pursuant to the tuition 22 23 reimbursement guidelines as provided in subsection (d). One change of program will be allowed without counseling. It is 24 25 provided, however, that all All training received at state 26 institutions of higher learning or state-supported community 27 or technical college qualifying schools under this subdivision 1 must be completed within a period of six years after the 2 beginning date of such two-year course or such prescribed 3 course its initiation.

"(2) Each child of such a disabled veteran shall be 4 5 entitled to five standard academic years, or the equivalent of 45 months if enrolled part-time, in any Alabama 6 7 state-supported institution of higher learning, college, or university, or to a prescribed course at an Alabama 8 9 state-supported community or technical college. If the course 10 of training at the community or technical college does not require the full time to which such child is entitled 11 12 hereunder, then the remaining entitlement may be taken in a 13 state-supported college or university only, qualifying school pursuant to the tuition reimbursement guidelines as provided 14 15 in subsection (d). One change of program will be allowed without counseling. Training under this subdivision must be 16 17 initiated prior to the child's twenty-sixth birthday, and must 18 be completed within eight years after its initiation, except for delays caused by military service during the training 19 20 period, and in no case may training be received under this 21 section beyond the thirty-fourth birthday of such the child.

"(b) For the purpose of the minimum disability requirement provided for in subsection (a), the dependent of any veteran whose disability rating as of July 31, 2017, is at least 20 percent but less than 40 percent shall qualify for the benefits of this chapter, provided that the dependent shall file application for such benefits before July 31, 2023, and the dependent is reasonably expected to be eligible to attend an Alabama institution of higher learning, college or university a qualifying school in the next academic year.

"(c) Except as provided in Section 31-6-11(e), the 4 5 The educational benefits provided by this section to spouses, children, and unmarried widows and widowers making application 6 7 for benefits for the first time beginning with the fall term of the 2014-2015 academic year, and thereafter, shall be 8 limited to undergraduate courses of study only, and the value 9 10 of tuition paid shall be limited to the in-state tuition rate 11 of the Alabama state-supported institution of higher learning, 12 college, or university qualifying school attended.

13 "(d) For those first filing for benefits under this chapter on or after July 31, 2017, and for those attending a 14 15 qualifying private school, the educational benefit shall be for tuition reimbursement and books and fees reimbursement. 16 17 The value of tuition paid per semester hour (or equivalent) 18 shall be limited to the rate of the Department of Defense Tuition Assistance Cap. The value of the books and fees paid 19 20 per semester shall be limited to  $\frac{1}{91,000}$  one thousand dollars 21 (\$1,000) per student.

"(e) The benefits provided under this section shall
be available in addition to federal government benefits. Any
child, spouse, or unmarried widow who was denied full
entitlement, 27 or 45 months, whichever the case may be, shall
have the remainder of their entitlement reinstated under this
chapter.

"(a) For those dependents who first file for
benefits under this chapter prior to July 31, 2017, the
benefits provided under this chapter shall be in addition to
any other state or federal benefits to which that dependent
may be entitled.

7 "(b) For dependents who first file for benefits
8 under this chapter on or after July 31, 2017, and for those
9 attending a qualifying private school:

"(1) To the extent permitted by law, prior to
applying any benefits provided for under this chapter,
institutional certifying officials and financial aid officials
shall first apply other federal, state, institutional, and
third party scholarships and grants awarded to the dependent
for that academic period for payment of required educational
expenses during an academic period.

17 "(2) A completed Free Application for Federal 18 Student Aid (FAFSA), or the equivalent, must be submitted to the United States Department of Education for each year in 19 20 which the dependent receives benefits under this chapter. The 21 dependent shall have applied for all federal student financial 22 aid grants, including, but not limited to, Pell Grants, Supplemental Education Opportunity Grants, and Education and 23 24 Training Vouchers, identified as being available for the 25 student's application by Federal Student Aid, an office of the 26 United States Department of Education, or its successor 27 agency.

"(3) All students receiving educational benefits 1 2 under this chapter and the educational institutions qualifying schools they attend must comply with the standards of 3 Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) as required for Title IV 4 5 benefits under the Higher Education Act and as defined by that education institution qualifying school. Those students who 6 7 would no longer be eligible to receive Title IV benefits due to a failure to meet SAP standards shall no longer be eligible 8 9 to receive benefits under this chapter. Education institutions 10 Each qualifying school shall notify the Alabama State Department of Veterans' Affairs of any student who 11 currently holds a certificate of eligibility for benefits 12 13 under this chapter who is no longer eligible to receive 14 benefits due to a failure to meet SAP standards and the 15 effective date of that change in eligibility.

16 "(4) The dependent shall ensure that all <u>qualifying</u> 17 schools they attend <u>he or she attends</u> under this program are 18 authorized to release such personally identifiable information 19 to the <u>Alabama State</u> Department of <u>Veterans Veterans'</u> Affairs 20 as is required for the determination of that dependent's 21 continued eligibility and as required for the completion of 22 all reports required by law.

"(c) Any dependent who receives benefits under this chapter, and whose benefit period is interrupted due to accident, injury, or illness, shall have the benefit time period which is lost due to such accident, illness, or injury restored to him or her.

"(d) Notwithstanding any other provision of this 1 2 chapter to the contrary, dependents of any veteran whose disability rating, if any, prior to May 23, 2017, was less 3 than 20 percent, but who had a claim for compensation pending 4 5 prior to that date which resulted in a final award by the United States Department of Veterans Affairs of at least 20 6 7 percent, shall be eligible for education benefits as the chapter read prior to May 23, 2017, if the dependent files an 8 9 application for benefits under this chapter within six months 10 of that final adjudication and provides proof satisfactory to the Alabama State Department of Veterans Veterans' Affairs 11 that they qualify he or she qualifies under this exception and 12 13 currently meet satisfies the eligibility requirements as the chapter read prior to May 23, 2017. 14

15 "§31-6-11.

"(a) Before an application of any veteran for
 benefits under this chapter can be approved, such veteran
 shall submit proof, satisfactory to the State Department of
 Veterans' Affairs, of all of the following:

"(2) Having been a permanent resident of the State
 of Alabama for at least one year immediately prior to his or
 her entrance into service.

24 "<del>(3) An honorable discharge or other proof of</del>

honorable termination of at least 24 months of service in the
 armed forces, or if such veteran was discharged or released by

reason of service-connected disability then proof of honorable
 termination of less than 24 months of service is acceptable.

3 "(b)(a) Before the application of a wife spouse,
4 widow, or child of a disabled veteran or a deceased veteran or
5 serviceman for educational benefits under this chapter is
6 approved, proof, satisfactory to the State Department of
7 Veterans' Affairs, must be submitted of all of the following:

8 "(1) Establishing the identification of such wife 9 <u>the spouse</u>, widow, or child as the wife <u>spouse</u>, widow, or 10 child of the veteran or serviceman, as the case may be.

"(2) Of the veteran or serviceman having been a 11 permanent resident of the State of Alabama for at least one 12 13 year immediately prior, to his or her entrance into service, 14 or if the applicant is the wife spouse, widow, or child of a 15 totally and permanently disabled veteran, then proof either of the veteran's having been a permanent resident of the State of 16 17 Alabama for at least one year prior to his or her entrance 18 into service or proof that the veteran has been a bona fide resident of this state for at least five years immediately 19 20 prior to the filing of the application for benefits under this 21 chapter or immediately prior to his or her death if the veteran is deceased. 22

"(3) Of the veteran or serviceman having been a
permanent resident of the State of Alabama for at least two
years immediately prior to the filing of the application for
benefits under this chapter or has filed an Alabama income tax
return as a resident individual for the previous ten 10 years

1 or is a current resident and was discharged from active duty 2 within the prior 12 months. If the veteran or serviceman is deceased, his or her dependent may still qualify if the 3 veteran or serviceman met this residency requirement at the 4 time of his or her death. Alabama income tax return 5 information, including, but not limited to, the type of return 6 7 filed, necessary to show the residency requirements under this chapter have been met is hereby exempted from the 8 9 confidentiality provisions of Section 40-2A-10, and shall be 10 provided by the Department of Revenue to the State Department of Veterans' Affairs upon request. Such requests and 11 12 the significance of the information provided, shall be 13 requested by the State Department of Veterans Veterans' 14 Affairs as necessary when other residency information is not 15 available, and the department shall promulgate adopt rules and procedures to effect the provisions of this section as needed. 16

17 "(4) Of the wife <u>spouse</u>, widow, or child being a
18 current resident of the State of Alabama.

19 "(5) An honorable discharge or other proof of 20 honorable termination of service of the veteran or serviceman 21 in the armed forces for a period of at least 90 days between 22 the dates mentioned in this chapter, or service of less than 23 90 days if the veteran or serviceman was discharged or 24 released by reason of <u>a qualifying service-connected</u> 25 disability.

26 "(c) The service upon which any benefits are awarded
 27 under this chapter shall have been rendered during wartime or

under extrahazardous conditions, except as provided otherwise 1 2 in this section; and this condition of eligibility shall be established by the State Department of Veterans' Affairs. 3 "(d) The service requirements provided for in 4 subsection (c) shall not apply to any person making 5 application for benefits under this chapter beginning with the 6 fall term of the 2014-2015 academic year, and thereafter. 7 "(e) Notwithstanding any other provision of this 8 chapter to the contrary, any person denied educational 9 10 benefits provided by this chapter based solely upon the service requirements provided for in subsection (c) shall be 11 12 eligible to receive the benefits the person would otherwise 13 have been entitled to had their application been approved at 14 the time of initial application, except as provided otherwise in this subsection. Any age limitation on the benefits 15 16 provided by this chapter shall be extended in like manner for 17 any such previously denied person to ensure that the person 18 has the opportunity to receive all benefits they would otherwise have been entitled. In order to receive any 19 20 educational benefits, such the previously denied person must 21 reapply for educational benefits with the State Department of 22 Veterans' Affairs and begin use of the educational benefits no 23 later than the fall term of the 2015-2016 academic year. The 24 value of tuition paid for any such previously denied person 25 shall be limited to the in-state tuition rate of the Alabama state institution of higher learning, college, or university 26 27 state-supported school attended.

"(f) (b) For those first filing for benefits under 1 2 this chapter on or after July 31, 2017, and for those attending a qualifying private school, the educational benefit 3 shall be for tuition reimbursement and books and fees 4 5 reimbursement. The value of tuition paid per semester hour (or equivalent) shall be limited to the rate of the Department of 6 7 Defense Tuition Assistance Cap. The value of the books and 8 fees paid per semester shall be limited to  $\frac{1}{2000}$  one thousand 9 dollars (\$1,000) per student.

"§31-6-12.

"The State Department of Veterans' Affairs is hereby 11 charged with the duty of informing the veterans and their 12 13 dependents in this state, through its county service commissioners and all other sources at its command, of the 14 15 provisions of this chapter in order that those veterans and their dependents may know of the benefits provided in this 16 17 chapter. The State Department of Veterans' Affairs shall 18 furnish and assist in preparing and producing all necessary blanks, forms, and other matters necessary for the veterans, 19 20 their wives spouses, widows, or children to obtain the 21 benefits provided under this chapter. The State Service 22 Commissioner shall cause to be forwarded to the state 23 institution of higher learning, college or university, or 24 state trade qualifying school of the applicant's choice, a 25 certificate of eligibility and entitlement, or other necessary proof for the veteran, his wife or her spouse, widow, or child 26 to obtain the benefits made available hereby. 27

"§31-6-13. 1 2 "The president or head of each state institution of 3 higher learning or college or university or state trade qualifying school must inform the faculty members of each 4 5 respective institution of the provisions and benefits of this 6 chapter, who in turn shall inform the wives spouses, widows, 7 and children of veterans attending such institutions as to their rights and benefits under the provisions of this 8 9 chapter. 10 "\$31-6-14. The county superintendent of education and the city 11 superintendent of schools in each respective county and city 12 13 must shall inform the teachers of their county and city of the 14 provisions and benefits of this chapter, who in turn shall 15 inform the children of veterans as to their rights and benefits under the provisions of this chapter. 16 "\$31-6-15. 17 18 "(a) The benefits provided in this chapter shall be paid from an annual appropriation from the Education Trust 19 20 Fund to reimburse every Alabama state institution of higher 21 learning, college, university, or Alabama community or 22 technical college qualifying school in which benefits are 23 given to veterans, their wives spouses, widows, or children 24 under this chapter. Such reimbursement Reimbursement shall be 25 made timely at the end of each academic quarter or semester for all tuition reimbursements for the certified invoices 26

Department of Veterans' Affairs, and shall be supported by names of the students receiving such benefits, together with the amounts claimed for each student. Any amount of in-state tuition, books, or fees not paid by the combination of federal, state, and third party funds may be billed to students receiving such benefits or waived by the institution or school.

"(b) The Department of Examiners of Public Accounts 8 9 may audit the records of any two-year or four-year institution 10 of higher education which receives any reimbursement as a result of this chapter to the same extent, degree, and scope 11 as audits performed on other public educational institutions, 12 13 and the institution shall submit to the Legislature and the 14 State Department of Veterans' Affairs each year, before any 15 subsequent reimbursement may be applied for or considered, a full accounting of any receipts, disbursements, assets, 16 liabilities, and other resources as of the date of the close 17 18 of the immediately preceding academic year.

20 "The State Department of Veterans Veterans' Affairs 21 shall report to the Legislature, by January 1st of each year, the number of applicants approved in the previous fiscal year 22 23 and those approved as of the reporting date for the current 24 fiscal year, the number of students by years of remaining 25 eligibility, and the costs of the previous fiscal year's 26 expenditures to the program by each category of public institution of higher learning qualifying school to include 27

1 the number of students who attended each of those institutions

"§31-6-16.

"Nothing in this chapter shall be construed as 4 5 lowering the standards or requirements, or as to making any 6 exceptions thereto for entrance into any of the state 7 qualifying schools or institutions affected by this chapter. All applicants, in order to obtain the educational benefits of 8 9 this chapter, must first meet all scholastic and other 10 requirements for entrance into any of the <u>qualifying</u> schools 11 coming within the purview of this chapter."
