15	required to pay any outstanding court-assessed fines, fees, or
16	costs.
17	(b) Within 30 days of release from custody, an
18	inmate shall contact the clerk of the court in the
19	jurisdiction or jurisdictions in which he or she has financial
20	obligations and shall enter into a repayment agreement for
21	outstanding court-assessed fines, fees, or costs.
22	(c) Persons in the custody of the Alabama Department
23	of Corrections shall not be required to pay any outstanding
24	court-assessed fines, fees, or costs while incarcerated. This
25	subsection shall not apply to an individual who has been
26	sentenced to a community corrections punishment authority or

community corrections program.

1	(d) This section shall not apply to any restitution
2	owed to a victim or any supervision fees assessed as a
