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of the United State's energy success, but are being blocked by
the federal government and many state governments; and

WHEREAS, the Biden administration continues to increase costs and delay efforts to develop oil and natural gas on federal lands and waters, despite the fact that the oil and gas production provides billions in revenue to federal, state, and local governments and supports conservation programs throughout the country; and

9 WHEREAS, United States offshore production is one of 10 the lowest carbon intensive energy-producing regions in the 11 world, and halting offshore leasing and development will shift 12 production and capital investment overseas and undermine 13 decades of environmental progress; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH 14 HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That we, the members of the Senate 15 and the House of Representatives of the State of Alabama, 16 17 strongly urge the President of the United States to take 18 measures and support policies that ensure long-term American energy leadership, security, and progress, including those 19 20 that result in the continued operation of existing oil and 21 natural gas pipelines, the construction of new oil and gas pipelines, the resumption of consistent, credible federal 22 23 lease sales, and the immediate preparation of a new five-year 24 program to guide future offshore leasing.

25 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Secretary of State 26 sends duly authenticated copies of this resolution to the 27 President of the United States, the United States Secretary of

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the Interior, the United States Secretary of Transportation,
the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission, the Alabama
Congressional delegation, and the news media of the state.
