8 RECOGNIZING THE 100TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE JUNIOR
9 LEAGUE OF BIRMINGHAM.

11 WHEREAS, it is a distinct privilege to recognize the
12 100th Anniversary of the Junior League of Birmingham; and

13 WHEREAS, on May 10, 1922, the Junior League of
14 Birmingham held its first meeting at South Highland
15 Presbyterian Church in Birmingham, Alabama; and

16 WHEREAS, the Junior League of Birmingham is an
17 organization of over 2,000 women committed to the mission of
18 promoting volunteerism, developing the potential of women, and
19 improving the community through the effective action and
20 leadership of trained volunteers; and

21 WHEREAS, the Junior League of Birmingham is the
22 ninth largest league; and

23 WHEREAS, throughout the years, the Junior League of
24 Birmingham has assisted in the development of various
25 organizations to better the community of Birmingham, including
26 the development of the Birmingham Children's Theater, the
27 Visiting Nurses Association, the Junior League Speech and

1 Hearing, Magic Moments, the Birmingham/Jefferson County Family
2 Violence Project, Better Basics, Literacy Council of Central
3 Alabama, Teen Court of the Alabama Center for Law and Civic
4 Education, and as an affiliate of the Dolly Parton Imagination
5 Library; and

6 WHEREAS, the Junior League of Birmingham welcomes
7 all women, valuing differences as assets by creating a culture
8 of inclusivity where the JLB is grounded to the mission,
9 recognizing this is what ties the Junior League of Birmingham
10 together; and

11 WHEREAS, the Junior League of Birmingham believes
12 that four Impact Areas are fundamental to the overall
13 well-being of a community and its individuals, including
14 Economic Security and Financial Stability, Education and
15 Culture, Health and Wellness, and Safety and Crisis; and

16 WHEREAS, last year the Junior League of Birmingham
17 provided over 45,000 volunteer hours in the Birmingham
18 community with a \$1.28 million total volunteer impact and
19 provided funds and volunteers for over 40 community projects
20 in the Birmingham area; and

21 WHEREAS, the Junior League of Birmingham has
22 demonstrated a record of leadership and volunteerism within
23 the community and is one of the leading service organizations
24 in Alabama; now therefore,

25 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH
26 HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That we recognize the 100th
27 Anniversary of the Junior League of Birmingham, and we extend

1 to all membership, the highest tribute and deepest adoration,
2 and request that all Alabama residents join us in honoring the
3 accomplishments of this organization.
