9	ALABAMA STATE HOUSE REPRESENTATIVE DAVID W. WHEELER.

11	WHEREAS, it is with profound sorrow that we note the
12	untimely death on March 9, 2022, of Alabama State House
13	Representative David W. Wheeler of Vestavia Hills, Alabama, at
14	the age of 72; and
15	WHEREAS, his passing leaves a void in the lives of
16	his loving family, many friends, and the entire community,
17	where he was highly regarded; and
18	WHEREAS, a man of steadfast diligence who wore many
19	hats, Representative Wheeler was a passionate servant and
20	leader throughout his home state of Alabama, to the Republican
21	Party, and at his alma mater, The University of Montevallo;

23	WHEREAS, Representative Wheeler was born on January
24	11, 1950, in Jemison, Alabama; and
25	WHEREAS, he earned a Bachelor's Degree in Accounting
26	from The University of Montevallo in 1972 and a Master of
27	Business Administration Degree from Samford University in

1976; from 1972 to 1988, he held various management and staff positions in the Accounting, Finance, Planning, and Budgeting Departments of Alabama Power, including the Director of Accounting, Finance, and Regulatory Services; a Certified Management Accountant; and the primary liaison for the Alabama Public Service Commission; from 1988 to 1993, he served as the Manager of Government and Federal Affairs for Alabama Power in Washington, D.C.; altogether, he worked for Alabama Power for 29 years; and

WHEREAS, in 2008, Representative Wheeler was appointed to The University of Montevallo Board of Trustees by Governor Bob Riley for a term ending in 2032; in addition, he served as Chair of the Personnel Committee and Vice Chair of the Board of Trustees and Executive Committee; in April 2009, the David W. and Diane R. Wheeler Endowed Scholarship was created at The University of Montevallo; and

WHEREAS, in 2018, Representative Wheeler was elected to his first term of office, serving House District 47 in the State of Alabama; he served as Treasurer of the Alabama Republican Party and as past Chairman of the Jefferson County Republican Party; he was also a member of the Jefferson County Republican Executive Committee, the Alabama Republican Steering Committee, and the Alabama Republican Executive Committee, and he was past Treasurer of the Mid-Alabama Republican Club; most recently, he served for three years as the President of Vulcan Termite and Pest Control, Inc.; he was
