11 THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, That immediately upon the adoption  
12 of this resolution, the following business, in the order set  
13 forth below, shall be the special and paramount order of  
14 business for the 25th legislative day taking precedence over  
15 the regular order of business or any pending or unfinished  
16 business.

17 Debate on each bill, including substitutes and  
18 amendments, is limited to 10 minutes. At the end of each  
19 10-minute period, any bill that has not passed will  
20 automatically revert to its position on the regular order  
21 calendar. These bills are not subject to motions to carry  
22 over temporarily or otherwise, but can revert to their  
23 position on the regular order calendar at the request of the  
24 sponsor.
