14 WHEREAS, cardiovascular disease affects men, women, 15 and children of every age and race in the United States; from 16 2019 to 2020, deaths from heart disease increased by 4.8 17 percent, the largest increase in heart disease deaths since 18 2012, and stroke deaths increased in the same period by six 19 percent; cardiovascular disease continues to be the leading 20 cause of death in the United States; and

21 WHEREAS, in 2015, cardiovascular disease accounted 22 for \$555,000,000,000 in health care expenditures and lost 23 productivity, and by 2035, cardiovascular disease will account 24 for \$1,093,900,000,000 in health care expenditures and lost 25 productivity annually; and WHEREAS, the global COVID-19 disease pandemic poses
 significantly high risk to individuals with cardiovascular
 disease and risk factors; and

WHEREAS, individuals in the United States have made great progress in reducing the death rate for cardiovascular disease, but the progress has been more modest with respect to the death rate for cardiovascular disease in women and minorities; and

9 WHEREAS, cardiovascular diseases are the number one 10 killer of women in the United States, killing more women than 11 all forms of cancer combined; cardiovascular disease is the 12 leading cause of maternal death in the United States, or more 13 simply put, heart disease is the number one killer of new 14 moms; and

15 WHEREAS, women, and especially Black and Hispanic 16 women, are disproportionately impacted by heart disease and 17 stroke; research shows that heart attacks are on the rise in 18 younger women, yet younger generations of women, namely 19 Generation Z and Millennials, are less likely to be aware of 20 their greatest health threat, including knowing the warning 21 signs of heart attacks and strokes; now therefore,

22 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF 23 THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, That in recognition of the 24 importance of the ongoing fight against heart disease and 25 stroke, we hereby resolve February 2022 to be American Heart 26 Month in the State of Alabama and urge all citizens to show 27 their support for the fight against heart disease by
