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11	Relating to the Connect Alabama Act of 2021; to
12	amend Sections 41-23-271, 41-23-273, and 41-23-274, Code of
13	Alabama 1975; and to specify the minimum service threshold; to
14	authorize the Alabama Digital Expansion Division chief to
15	enter nondisclosure agreements; and to revise the expenditure
16	of the Connect Alabama Fund and allow for annual revision of
17	the program funds.
18	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
19	Section 1. Sections 41-23-271, 41-23-273, and
20	41-23-274, Code of Alabama 1975, are amended to read as
21	follows:
22	"§41-23-271.
23	"For the purposes of this article, the following
24	terms shall have the following meanings:
25	"(1) ADECA. The Alabama Department of Economic and
26	Community Affairs.

"(2) AUTHORITY. The Alabama Digital Expansion
 Authority.

"(3) CONNECT ALABAMA FUND. A fund created within the
State Treasury to be administered by the Alabama Digital
Expansion Finance Corporation, with funds distributed by the
corporation to ADECA for use by the division for the
implementation and administration of the statewide
connectivity plan.

9 "(4) CORPORATION. The Alabama Digital Expansion 10 Finance Corporation.

11 "(5) DIVISION. The Alabama Digital Expansion12 Division of ADECA.

"(6) END USER. A residential, business,
institutional, or government entity that uses broadband
services for its own purposes and does not resell the
broadband services to other entities.

17 "(7) MIDDLE MILE PROJECT. A broadband infrastructure 18 project that does not provide broadband service to end users 19 or to end-user devices.

"(8) MINIMUM SERVICE THRESHOLD. A connection to the
Internet that provides capacity for transmission at a minimum
speed per customer necessary to meet the definition of
advanced telecommunications capability for fixed broadband
services as set by the Federal Communications Commission of at
least 100 megabits (100 Mbps) per second downstream and at
least 20 megabits (20 Mbps) per second upstream.

1 "(9) PROVIDER-SPECIFIC INFORMATION. Any information 2 given to ADECA or its agents by a broadband service provider 3 that identifies the provider's location-specific service 4 availability details, construction plans, or business 5 operations details that are not otherwise readily 6 ascertainable by proper means through third parties without 7 substantial effort.

8 "<del>(9)</del> <u>(10)</u> RURAL AREA. Any area within this state not 9 included within the boundaries of any incorporated city or 10 town having a population of more than 25,000 inhabitants, 11 according to the last federal census.

12 "(10) (11) UNSERVED AREA. Any area that is 13 determined by the division to not have at least one provider 14 of terrestrial broadband service that offers a connection to 15 the Internet that meets or exceeds the minimum service 16 threshold.

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"§41-23-273.

18 "(a) The Alabama Digital Expansion Division is created as a division of ADECA. The division shall be run by a 19 20 division chief, who shall be appointed by the Director of 21 ADECA, with the approval of the Governor, from a list of three 22 nominees submitted by the authority. The division chief shall 23 report to, and be under the direct supervision of, the 24 Director of ADECA. The division chief shall carry out the functions and duties of the division. The division chief shall 25 26 be knowledgeable in matters relating to broadband and shall 27 have no financial interest in any broadband or related

business or enterprise which would conflict or be inconsistent with his or her duties as division chief. The division chief shall be employed in the exempt service.

"(b) The division chief shall have the power and 4 5 authority necessary to carry out the functions and duties of the division. All functions and duties of the division shall 6 7 be exercised by the division chief or through such employees 8 or other individuals the division chief may designate. In the 9 performance and exercise of such powers, authorities, 10 functions, and duties, the division chief and other employees of the division shall be subject to all legal requirements, 11 12 restrictions, limitations, conditions, and penalties, whether 13 civil or criminal. These powers, authorities, functions, and 14 duties include, but are not limited to, the following:

"(1) Exercise duties as the chief executive of the division and exercise, consistent with this article and other applicable laws, all the powers, authority, and duties vested by this article and any other applicable ADECA policies and regulations or laws providing for the operation of the division.

"(2) Employ, with the approval of the Director of ADECA, all individuals necessary for the efficient operation of the division, including professional, technical, clerical, and other staff, including attorneys, special counsel, and consultants as are necessary to accomplish the objectives of this article.

1	"(3) Enter into nondisclosure agreements to protect			
2	proprietary information. All provider-specific information			
3	provided under a nondisclosure agreement shall be presumed			
4	confidential and proprietary and shall not be considered a			
5	public record. Provider-specific information shall not be			
6	released to any person other than to the submitting broadband			
7	services provider and to appropriate ADECA staff, agents, or			
8	contractors without the express written consent of the			
9	submitting broadband services provider. Provider-specific			
10	information shall only be used for broadband mapping, policy			
11	development, grant eligibility purposes, and furthering the			
12	broadband goals of the state.			
13	"(c) Upon approval by the Director of ADECA, the			
14	division chief may establish technical and other advisory			

14 division chief may establish technical and other advisory 15 committees to advise the division with respect to specific 16 objectives.

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"§41-23-274.

18 "The division, in collaboration with the authority,19 shall have all of the following powers and duties:

"(1) To promote the expansion and availability of high-speed broadband networks, services, and technologies throughout the state, including, but not limited to, rural areas, underserved areas, and unserved areas of the state.

"(2) To develop and begin executing a statewide
connectivity plan, as approved by the authority, to facilitate
the expansion and availability of high-speed broadband
networks, services, and technologies throughout the state,

1 including a timeline for implementation of the plan. The 2 Director of ADECA shall submit the proposed plan to the authority for approval on or before July 1, 2022. The plan 3 must consider the need for broadband expansion in rural areas, 4 5 underserved areas, and unserved areas, as well as any other obstacles to broadband adoption. It shall include 6 7 recommendations for funding, and plans for implementation of the following objectives, including, but not limited to: 8

9 "a. Evaluation of the state's existing long-haul and 10 middle mile network.

"b. Projects for the development and expansion of a 11 12 secure, reliable, robust, multi-purpose, and high-quality 13 long-haul and middle mile fiber network throughout the state. 14 Projects shall be implemented in the most cost effective and efficient manner for the state and should utilize existing, 15 available infrastructure where it is consistent with the plan 16 17 and meets the speeds, service quality, and other priorities 18 established by this article, the plan, or the authority.

"c. Projects for providing last-mile infrastructure and lit services for specific applications and use cases that are determined by the division to be a priority supported by the network or portions of the network funded under the statewide connectivity plan.

24 "d. Consideration of suggestions and recommendations25 of the Alabama Supercomputer Authority.

"(3) To implement the authority-approved statewideconnectivity plan and to enter into contracts and leases for

purposes consistent with the priorities of the plan. In developing the statewide connectivity plan, the division may seek input from incumbent Internet service providers, other service providers, and other owners and operators of infrastructure involved in providing high-speed broadband service.

7 "(4) To establish and administer a broadband 8 accessibility the Connect Alabama grant program programs, in collaboration with the authority, for the purpose of promoting 9 10 the deployment and adoption of high-speed broadband Internet networks, services, and technologies throughout the state, 11 including, but not limited to, rural areas, underserved areas, 12 13 and unserved areas of the state consistent with the 14 requirements of this article. For three years following May 17, 2021, 70 percent of the state Funds received by the 15 16 Connect Alabama Fund shall be expended by the division for the extension of last-mile infrastructure in unserved areas at 17 18 minimum speeds as determined by the statewide connectivity 19 plan, as well as the establishment and administration of a 20 middle mile program and line extension program. ADECA may 21 establish additional Connect Alabama grant programs in accordance with the goals of the statewide connectivity plan. 22 23 The funding amounts for programs established under this 24 article shall be evaluated for increase or decrease annually 25 with recommendations from the division and approval by the authority. After this time, all All funds received for the 26 27 statewide connectivity plan Connect Alabama grant program

shall be expended according to the goals of the program and the statewide connectivity plan, as identified by the division, and subject to any applicable legal requirements. Federal and other funds received by <u>ADECA or</u> the Connect Alabama Fund shall be expended by the division in accordance with the statewide connectivity plan and any legal requirements applicable to those funds.

8 "(5) To adopt rules and policies, as approved by 9 ADECA, within 90 days of establishing and receiving the 10 initial funding for the statewide connectivity plan, to 11 administer the program and to begin to accept applications for 12 grants, including any rules necessary to meet the future needs 13 of the grant program.

14 "(6) To develop strategies and support efforts to 15 attract and leverage grant funds, federal resources, and 16 private investment in furtherance of this article.

17 "(7) To accept and receive funds, gifts, grants, 18 property, labor, or other monetary or in-kind contributions of 19 any type or from any source, including, but not limited to, 20 federal and state grants, appropriations, loans, and loan 21 guarantees.

"(8) To administer the distribution of funds, grants, loans, loan guarantees, or other funds and resources received by the division and to ensure that grant funds awarded under this article are used for the purposes specified in this article.

"(9) To promote and encourage private investments
 and applications for available grants.

3 "(10) To perform any other actions necessary or
4 convenient for the implementation and administration of this
5 article and in compliance with state and federal law."

6 Section 2. This act shall become effective 7 immediately following its passage and approval by the 8 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
