SYNOPSIS: Under existing law, in any Class 4 municipality organized under Chapter 44B of the Code of Alabama 1975, the election for the mayor, the members of the city council, and the members of the city board of education is held on the first Tuesday of March and every four years thereafter.

This bill would provide that the election for the mayor, the members of the city council, and the members of the city board of education of the city would be held on the third Tuesday of May and every four years thereafter.

A BILL  
TO BE ENTITLED  
AN ACT

Relating to any Class 4 municipality organized under Chapter 44B of the Code of Alabama 1975; to amend Section 11-44B-4.1 of the Code of Alabama 1975, to reset the date of

1 election for the mayor, the members of the city council, and  
2 the members of the city board of education.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

4 Section 1. Section 11-44B-4.1 of the Code of Alabama  
5 1975, is amended to read as follows:

6 "§11-44B-4.1.

7 "(a) This section shall only apply in a Class 4  
8 municipality organized pursuant to this chapter.

9 "(b) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, in  
10 any Class 4 municipality organized pursuant to this chapter,  
11 the election for the mayor, members of the city council, and  
12 members of the city board of education of the Class 4  
13 municipality shall be held on the ~~first~~ third Tuesday in ~~March~~  
14 May and every four years thereafter. When necessary, as  
15 provided for other municipal elections, a second or run-off  
16 election shall be held on the fourth Tuesday following the  
17 regular election. Officers elected shall assume the duties of  
18 their respective offices on the first Monday in August  
19 following their election. All officers shall serve until their  
20 successors are elected and qualified."

21 Section 2. This act shall become effective  
22 immediately following its passage and approval by the  
23 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
