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11	WHEREAS, many cities throughout the state have
12	adopted occupational taxes; and
13	WHEREAS, there is a need to review occupational
14	taxes across the state to better understand how they impact
15	working families; now therefore,
16	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH
17	HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That there is established the
18	Alabama Occupational Tax Interim Study Commission.
19	(a) The study commission shall be composed of the
20	following members:
21	(1) Three members of the House of Representatives
22	appointed by the Speaker of the House, one of whom must be a
23	member of the minority party.
24	(2) Three members of the Senate appointed by the
25	President Pro Tempore of the Senate, one of whom must be a
26	member of the minority party.

- 1 (3) One member appointed by the Executive Director 2 of the Alabama League of Municipalities.
- 3 (4) One member representing the business community,
 4 appointed by the Lieutenant Governor.

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- (5) One member representing the small business community, appointed by the Lieutenant Governor.
- (b) The appointing authorities shall coordinate their appointments to assure that the study commission is inclusive and reflects the racial, gender, geographic, urban, rural, and economic diversity of the state.
- (c) The first meeting of the study commission shall be held not later than 60 days after the passage of this resolution. The study commission shall elect a chair at its first meeting. Following its first meeting, the study commission may hold meetings at the call of the chair or a majority of its members.
- (d)(1) Legislative members of the task force shall be entitled to their legislative compensation, per diem, and travel expenses for each day they attend a meeting of the task force in accordance with Amendment 871 of the Constitution of 1901, now appearing as Section 49.01 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901. These payments shall be paid out of funds appropriated to the use of the Legislature by means of warrants drawn by the Comptroller on the State Treasury.
- (2) Non-legislative members of the task force shall serve without compensation, but may be reimbursed by their

respective appointing authority for expenses related to attending meetings.

- (e) The Legislative Services Agency, the Clerk of the House of Representatives, and the Secretary of the Senate shall provide administrative and other assistance for the work of the study commission as necessary.
- (f) The study commission shall have the following
 duties:
 - (1) Study existing occupational taxes across the state, including their impact on Alabama workers.
 - (2) Determine what, if any, changes need to be made to Alabama law relating to occupational taxes.
 - (g) The study commission shall prepare and submit a report of its findings, conclusions, and any recommendations for legislative action related to occupational taxes to the Legislature no later than the third legislative day of the 2023 Regular Session. Upon submitting its report to the Legislature, the study commission shall be dissolved and discharged of any further duties and liabilities.
 - (h) Upon its passage, a copy of this resolution shall be provided to each of the appointing authorities.
