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## SYNOPSIS:

This bill would create the Alabama Ad Valorem

Advisory Committee, a local advisory committee to

provide the Commissioner of the Alabama Department of

Revenue with an established communication method to

engage with local officials in matters pertaining to ad

valorem taxes and real property and personal fees.

This bill would establish the membership of the local advisory committee and provide for its duties.

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A BILL

TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

Relating to tax officials; to establish the Alabama Ad Valorem Advisory Committee to provide input and recommendations to the Commissioner of the Department of Revenue, and to provide for its membership and duties.

23 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. (a) For purposes of this subsection, a local official eligible for service on the committee is an elected or appointed official charged with the assessing or collecting, or both, of ad valorem taxes and other fees on real and personal property at the county level.



29 (b) (1) To ensure consistent and purposeful
30 communication between the Commissioner of the Alabama
31 Department of Revenue and local officials on matters
32 pertaining to the assessment and collection of ad valorem
33 taxes and other fees on real and personal property, the
34 Alabama Ad Valorem Advisory Committee is established. The

committee shall consist of the following:

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- a. One local official from each of the congressional
  districts appointed by the commissioner from a list of three
  recommendations per district submitted by the Association of
  Alabama Tax Administrators.
- 40 b. The presiding president and vice president of the
  41 Association of Alabama Tax Administrators.
- c. Two local officials appointed by the commissioner.
- (2) If the Association of Alabama Tax Administrators
  fails to timely submit a list of recommendations for
  appointment to the committee, the commissioner may appoint a
  local official from that respective congressional district.
  - (3) If a vacancy on the committee occurs, the commissioner shall fill the vacancy from the list of three recommendations submitted by the Association of Alabama Tax Administrators or request that a new list of three recommendations be provided by the association.
  - (4) The commissioner and the Association of Alabama Tax Administrators shall ensure that the recommendations and appointments reflect the gender, racial, and geographical diversity of the State of Alabama.
    - (c) The members of the committee shall serve one year



- 57 terms and are eligible for reappointment if recommended by the
- 58 Association of Alabama Tax Administrators. The initial
- 59 appointment recommendations shall be made no later than August
- 1, 2023, and each August 1 thereafter. The commissioner shall
- appoint the members of the committee no later than September 1
- 62 of each year.
- (d) Committee members shall receive no compensation or
- 64 reimbursement of expenses from the state for serving on the
- 65 committee. The local officials may be reimbursed for travel as
- 66 provided by law for their official duties.
- (e) The committee shall hold its first meeting no later
- than October 1, 2023. The commissioner shall set the date,
- time, and location of the first meeting. The advisory
- 70 committee may elect a chair and vice chair and shall determine
- 71 the timing and frequency of subsequent meetings. The advisory
- 72 committee shall meet no less than four times per year.
- 73 (f) The committee shall meet with the commissioner or
- his or her designee and other employees of the Department of
- 75 Revenue as the commissioner deems appropriate. The
- 76 commissioner shall present specific questions, issues, policy
- 77 considerations, or other matters deemed appropriate to the
- 78 committee for input, review, and possible recommendation.
- 79 Likewise, the committee may present additional questions,
- 80 issues, policy considerations, or other matters for input,
- 81 review, and possible recommendation. The committee shall make
- 82 no review or recommendation pertaining to any other department
- 83 matter.
- 84 (g) Formal recommendations from the committee shall be



made to the commissioner by affirmative vote of a majority of 85 86 the membership. The commissioner shall respond to the 87 recommendations as he or she deems appropriate, including a 88 written response to the committee, or the appointment of 89 additional committees or work groups composed of employees of 90 the Department of Revenue and local officials. 91 Section 2. This act shall become effective immediately 92 following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its 93 otherwise becoming law.
