House Bill 502 as reported by the Committee on Ports, Waterways and Intermodal Transit would increase the administrative obligations of the Alabama Law Enforcement Agency (ALEA) by providing for the oversight and maintenance of navigational markers on certain waters of the state through the establishment of a uniform system of permitting such markers, in accordance with federal law.

In addition, this bill could increase the obligations of counties or municipalities that elect to place such markers, by an undetermined amount dependent on the cost to procure, install, and maintain approved navigational markers.
