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SYNOPSIS:

This bill would create four additional circuit judgeships and three additional district judgeships, to be elected in the 2024 General Election, as follows: An additional circuit judgeship, designated as Circuit Judgeship Number 4, in the Eleventh Judicial Circuit comprised of Lauderdale County; an additional circuit judgeship, designated as Circuit Judgeship Number 4, in the Nineteenth Judicial Circuit comprised of Autauga, Chilton, and Elmore Counties; an additional circuit judgeship, designated as Circuit Judgeship Number 9, in the Twenty-third Judicial Circuit comprised of Madison County; an additional circuit judgeship, designated as Circuit Judgeship Number 6, in the Twenty-eighth Judicial Circuit comprised of Baldwin County; an additional district judgeship, designated as District Judgeship Number 3, in Baldwin County; an additional district judgeship, designated as District Judgeship Number 2, in DeKalb County; and an additional district judgeship, designated as District Judgeship Number 6, in Mobile County.

This bill would create four additional circuit judgeships and two additional district judgeships, to be elected in the 2026 General Election, as follows: An additional circuit judgeship, designated as Circuit



Judgeship Number 7, in the Sixth Judicial Circuit comprised of Tuscaloosa County; an additional circuit judgeship, designated as Circuit Judgeship Number 5, in the Nineteenth Judicial Circuit comprised of Autauga, Chilton, and Elmore Counties; an additional circuit judgeship, designated as Circuit Judgeship Number 7, in the Twenty-eighth Judicial Circuit comprised of Baldwin County; an additional circuit judgeship, designated as Circuit Judgeship Number 4, in the Thirty-seventh Judicial Circuit comprised of Lee County; an additional district judgeship, designated as District Judgeship Number 5, in Madison County; and an additional district judgeship, designated as District Judgeship Number 3, in Shelby County.

This bill would provide for the authority of the judges and for the compensation and benefits of the judges.

This bill would prohibit the Judicial Resources Allocation Commission from reallocating any vacant judgeships until January 1, 2027.

This bill would require the Administrative Office of Courts to provide certain statistical data annually.

Relating to judges; to provide for additional circuit judgeships and additional district judgeships; to provide for the authority of the judges and for the compensation and benefits of the judges; to prohibit the Judicial Resources Allocation Commission from reallocating any vacant judgeships until January 1, 2027; and to require the Administrative Office of Courts to provide certain statistical data annually.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1.(a)(1) There is created an additional circuit judgeship for the Eleventh Judicial Circuit which shall be designated as Circuit Judgeship Number 4.

- (2) There is created an additional circuit judgeship for the Nineteenth Judicial Circuit which shall be designated as Circuit Judgeship Number 4. The judge elected to Judgeship Number 4 may reside in any county within the Nineteenth Judicial Circuit. The judge occupying Judgeship Number 4 shall be assigned to the domestic relations division of the circuit.
- (3) There is created an additional circuit judgeship for the Twenty-third Judicial Circuit which shall be designated as Circuit Judgeship Number 9.
- 78 (4) There is created an additional circuit judgeship 79 for the Twenty-eighth Judicial Circuit which shall be 80 designated as Circuit Judgeship Number 6.
- (5) There is created an additional district judgeship for Baldwin County which shall be designated as District

 Judgeship Number 3.
- 84 (6) There is created an additional district judgeship



- for DeKalb County which shall be designated as District Judgeship Number 2.
- (7) There is created an additional district judgeship for Mobile County which shall be designated as District

 Judgeship Number 6.
- 90 (b) The additional judgeships created pursuant to 91 subsection (a) shall be filled at the 2024 General Election.
- 92 (c) The initial judges elected to the additional 93 judgeships created pursuant to subsection (a) shall serve for 94 a six-year term holding office from the first Monday following 95 the second Tuesday in January after the general election at 96 which the judges are elected.
