7	AN ACT
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9	Relating to consumption of fishes; to require the State
10	Health Officer to issue advisories concerning fish consumption
11	and to establish a panel to advise on and discuss this issue;
12	to require the Department of Environmental Management to test
13	fishes for pollutants and post signage at water bodies
14	notifying of an active fish consumption advisory; to require
15	the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources to notify
16	fish license purchasers of all active advisories.
17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
18	Section 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as
19	the Safe and Healthy Outdoor Recreation Act of 2023.
20	Section 2. The Legislature finds and declares the
21	following:
22	(1) That outdoor recreation, including catching,
23	cooking, and eating fish is a fundamental way of life for
24	countless residents of this state.
25	(2) That all Alabamians should have the right to know
26	whether it is safe to consume the fish they catch.
27	(3) That outdoor recreation-related illnesses stemming
28	from contact with polluted waters and contaminated fish pose a



29 severe public health risk to the people of Alabama.

30 (4) That persons who legally discharge pollutants into 31 state waters owe a duty to the public to provide a clear and 32 concise notification of where such discharge points are 33 located.

34 Section 3. (a) The State Health Officer, in 35 consultation with the Director of the Alabama Department of 36 Environmental Management, shall issue a fish consumption 37 advisory when it is reasonable and necessary to protect public health and well-being. The Alabama Department of Public Health 38 39 shall publish the advisory on its website in a clear and concise manner and maintain a dedicated telephone number to 40 provide information related to the advisory. 41

(b) The State Health Officer shall establish an 42 43 advisory panel to analyze, develop, and implement the fish consumption advisory program. The panel shall consist of, in a 44 number to be determined by the State Health Officer, 45 46 representatives from the Alabama Department of Public Health, 47 the Alabama Department of Environmental Management, the 48 Department of Conservation and Natural Resources, and any 49 other agency, business, nongovernmental organization, or 50 individual the State Health Officer determines appropriate. 51 The panel shall meet at least annually and consider tissue 52 sampling methodologies, water bodies, and fish species to be sampled, pollutant toxicity limits, strategies for 53 54 communicating consumption advisories to the public, and any 55 other subjects relevant to the program.

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Section 4. The Alabama Department of Environmental



57 Management, in consultation with the Alabama Department of 58 Public Health, shall conduct regular fish tissue monitoring to 59 evaluate safe consumption levels of fish species. The Alabama 60 Department of Environmental Management shall annually publish 61 a report on its website, which shall be made available for 62 public comment, detailing and identifying the methodology and 63 reasoning for evaluating the species and pollutants chosen.

64 Section 5. The Alabama Department of Environmental 65 Management shall post signage at any public boat ramp or fishing area adjacent to state waters with an active fish 66 67 consumption advisory notifying the public of this fact. The signage shall include a picture and the common name of each 68 fish species with an active advisory, the recommended 69 70 consumption levels for humans of these species, a specific 71 warning for pregnant or nursing women, and an Internet address and telephone number from which to obtain additional 72 73 information a telephone number for the department, an Internet 74 address, and quick responses code for a website from which to 75 obtain information about fish consumption advisories, water 76 quality, and water discharge permits. The Alabama Department 77 of Environmental Management may work with other state 78 agencies, political subdivisions of the state, nongovernmental 79 organizations, private corporations, or any other organization 80 to implement this subsection.

81 Section 6. The Department of Conservation and Natural 82 Resources shall, with each issuance of an electronic fishing 83 license, notify the licensee of current fish consumption 84 advisories by providing an Internet address to access all



85 active advisories online.

86 Section 7. This act shall become effective immediately

87 following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its

88 otherwise becoming law.
