10	Relating to public contracts; to provide circumstances
11	under which a conflict of interest exists in the procurement
12	of a public contract; to provide criminal penalties for a
13	violation; and in connection therewith would have as its
14	purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased
15	expenditure of local funds within the meaning of Section
16	111.05 of the Constitution of Alabama of 2022.
17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
18	Section 1. (a) When an individual, through a public
19	contract, provides services as a building construction design
20	professional, as defined under Section 41-9A-3, Code of
21	Alabama 1975, or anyone assembling bid documents, whether as
22	an employee or a contractor or consultant, a conflict of
23	interest exists if the individual is also employed by, or
24	contractor to, a vendor for any materials, products, or other
25	tangible property used for or to be incorporated into the
26	design of that public contract for building construction.
27	(b) A violation of this section is a violation of the
28	Ethics Law, Chapter 25 of Title 36, Code of Alabama 1975.

29 Section 2. Although this bill would have as its purpose 30 or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of 31 local funds, the bill is excluded from further requirements 32 and application under Section 111.05 of the Constitution of 33 Alabama of 2022, because the bill defines a new crime or 34 amends the definition of an existing crime.

35 Section 3. This act shall become effective on the first 36 day of the third month following its passage and approval by 37 the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
