29 by the judge of probate. On the ballots used at the election, 30 the proposition to be voted on shall be stated substantially 31 as follows:

"Do you favor the local law authorizing the Sheriff of Winston County to conduct fundraising events, including, but not limited to, rodeos and fishing tournaments, and to use the proceeds and profits from the events for any lawful purpose relating to the operation of the office of the sheriff, or for distribution to charitable organizations, including volunteer fire departments? Yes _____No ____."
