1 Enrolled, An Act,

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3 To authorize the Chilton County Commission, pursuant to
4 Section 217 of the Constitution of Alabama of 2022, to
5 continue at the rate at which there is levied and collected by
6 the county, on all taxable property situated in the county,
7 the ad valorem tax for a trade school and rural and industrial
8 development in the county now levied at the rate of 3 mills on
9 each dollar of assessed value, at a maximum rate, for any tax
10 year of the county, which is equal to \$.30 on each one hundred
11 dollars (3 mills on each dollar) of assessed value, until
12 December 31, 2044.

13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

14 Section 1. Chilton County presently levies and collects
15 a special tax for a trade school and rural and industrial
16 development in the county at a rate of \$.30 on each one
17 hundred dollars (3 mills on each dollar) of assessed value
18 pursuant to an election held in the county on November 10,
19 2004. That tax will expire on December 31, 2024. Pursuant to a
20 resolution adopted by the county commission in accordance with
21 Section 217 of the Constitution of Alabama 2022, the county
22 proposes to continue the rate at which it may levy and collect
23 the special tax to a maximum rate, for any tax year, which is
24 equal to \$.30 on each one hundred dollars (3 mills on each
25 dollar) of assessed value, until December 31, 2044.

26 Section 2. Pursuant to subsection (f) of Section 217
27 and a resolution adopted by the county commission after a
28 public hearing, the county commission may continue to levy the



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29 special tax to a maximum rate, for any tax year, which is
30 equal to \$.30 on each hundred dollars (3 mills on each dollar)
31 of assessed value, until December 31, 2044.

32 Section 3. The continuation of the rate at which the
33 special tax may be levied and collected pursuant to this act
34 is subject to the approval of a majority of the qualified
35 electors residing in the county who vote on the proposed
36 continuation at the next general, primary, constitutional, or
37 special election held for that purpose.

38 Section 4. This act shall become effective immediately
39 following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its
40 otherwise becoming law.
