4 Relating to building codes; to provide a limited
5 exemption to applicable building codes for certain nonprofit
6 veterans' organizations that acquire certain buildings under
7 certain conditions.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

9 Section 1. (a) As used in this section, "nonprofit
10 veterans' organization" means any nonprofit organization that
11 has a tax-exempt status under 26 U.S.C. § 501(c)(3) and, as
12 its primary purpose, supports veterans and active duty
13 servicemembers, as defined pursuant to 50 U.S.C. § 3911, and
14 their dependents.

15 (b) Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, when a
16 nonprofit veterans' organization, by means of a reversionary
17 clause in a deed, acquires a possessory interest in a state
18 armory building, with the intent to use the facility to
19 further the organization's support of veterans, active duty
20 servicemembers, and their dependents, the building shall be
21 exempt from compliance with any applicable state or local
22 building codes for not less than 10 calendar years from the
23 date of acquisition.

24 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first
25 day of the third month following its passage and approval by
26 the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
