1 2 3 4 HJR CONGRATULATING RONALD JACKSON FOR BEING INDUCTED INTO 5 THE ALABAMA HIGH SCHOOL SPORTS HALL OF FAME. 6 7 WHEREAS, highest commendations and congratulations 8 are hereby presented to Coach Ronald "Jack" Jackson for his 9 induction into the Alabama High School Sports Hall of Fame as a member of the Class of 2023; and 10 WHEREAS, Coach Jackson is a 1977 graduate of Dallas 11 County High School and matriculated to the University of 12 13 Mississippi and graduated in 1982; he was an exceptional 14 basketball player at both schools; he later earned a 15 Master's Degree in 1987 from the University of Mississippi;

17 WHEREAS, Coach Jackson led the Monroe County High 18 School Girls Basketball Team to the 1987 State Championship and broke the state's longest-running winning streak in 19 girls' basketball history at that time; in 1991, Coach 20 21 Jackson took over the T.R. Miller High School basketball 22 program and launched a 62-game winning streak and earned four girls' state basketball titles; during his tenure as a 23 24 basketball coach, he has not only coached five state 25 champion teams, he has three state runner-up finishes, and 26 guided 13 teams to the Alabama High School Athletic 27 Association State Basketball Championships Final Four; he has a boys and girls teams combined coaching record of 1,006 28

29 wins and 335 losses; he coached the Alabama-Mississippi 30 All-Star Classic in 1995, 2002, and 2009; and

31 WHEREAS, Coach Jackson is also heavily involved in 32 his community where he serves on the Senior Citizen 33 Commissions Club and the Jones Memorial Freedom Church 34 Deacon Board; he also volunteers his time and talents as a 35 Sunday School teacher and to work on projects that provide 36 for the homeless and underprivileged; now therefore,
