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4 HJR___ CREATING THE OVERSIGHT COMMISSION ON ALABAMA OPIOID
5 SETTLEMENT FUNDS.

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7 WHEREAS, the State of Alabama has reached settlement 8 agreements with several parties that will provide millions 9 of dollars to the state for an undetermined period of years 10 for the abatement of the opioid crisis; and

11 WHEREAS, the Legislature recognizes that priorities 12 for the investment of opioid settlement funds should include 13 programs and services with evidence-based results in the 14 treatment and prevention of opioid use and addiction; and

15 WHEREAS, the Legislature recognizes that judicious 16 investment of the opioid settlement funds on behalf of 17 Alabama taxpayers and those impacted by the opioid crisis is 18 critical and requires a collaborative effort between the 19 Legislature, the Executive Branch, experts, and 20 stakeholders; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That there is created the Oversight Commission on Alabama Opioid Settlement Funds to develop a statewide plan for the investment and use of opioid settlement funds and review the expenditure of funds appropriated to agencies and entities to ensure expenditures achieve the best results for Alabama's opioid crisis.

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28 (a) The membership of the commission shall consist 29 of all of the following: (1) The Commissioner of the Department of Mental 30 31 Health, or his or her designee. 32 (2) The Director of the Board of Pardons and Paroles, or his or her designee. 33 34 (3) The State Health Officer, or his or her 35 designee. (4) The Director of Finance, or his or her designee. 36 37 (5) An expert in programs and services for opioid treatment and abatement, appointed by the Attorney General. 38 (6) An expert in programs and services for opioid 39 40 treatment and abatement, appointed by the Governor. 41 (7) An expert in programs and services for opioid 42 treatment and abatement, appointed by the Lieutenant 43 Governor. 44 (8) An expert in programs and services for opioid 45 treatment and abatement for veterans, appointed by the 46 Commissioner of the Department of Veterans Affairs. 47 (9) The Speaker of the House of Representatives, or his or her designee. 48 49 (10) The President Pro Tempore of the Senate, or his or her designee. 50 51 (11) The Chair of the Senate Finance and 52 Taxation-General Fund Committee, or his or her designee. 53 (12) The Chair of the House Ways and Means-General 54 Fund Committee, or his or her designee.

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(13) Two members of the House of Representatives
appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.
(14) Two members of the Senate, appointed by the
President Pro Tempore of the Senate.

(b) The Oversight Commission on Alabama Opioid
Settlement Funds shall be inclusive and reflect the racial,
gender, geographic, urban, rural, and economic diversity of
the state.

(c) The Chair of the House Ways and Means-General 63 64 Fund Committee shall serve as chair of the commission. The commission shall meet as soon as practical at a time and 65 place set by the chair. The commission shall meet at the 66 67 call of the chair following the initial meeting and as investment plans are presented for review but not less than 68 69 semiannually. Notice of the meetings of the commission shall be provided in a manner consistent with the rules of the 70 71 Legislature.

(d) The legislative members of the commission shall be entitled to their legislative compensation, per diem, and travel expenses for each day they attend a meeting of the commission in accordance with Section 49 of the Constitution of Alabama of 2022.

(e) Other members of the commission may be reimbursed for necessary expenses in attending meetings of the commission according to policies and procedures of their respective appointing authorities.

81 (f) Pursuant to Section 36-14-17.1, Code of Alabama
82 1975, the commission shall provide to the Secretary of State

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83 a notice of all meetings, the name of each member's service 84 on the commission, and a copy of its findings and other 85 documents produced throughout the duration of the 86 commission.

87 (g) The amount of five thousand dollars (\$5,000)
88 shall be the total amount that may be expended by the
89 commission in any one year.

90 (h) The commission shall continue in existence until
91 all opioid settlement funds have been appropriated and
92 expended, at which time the commission shall stand
93 dissolved.
