1 2 3 HJR ESTABLISHING THE JOINT STUDY COMMISSION ON GROCERY 4 5 TAXATION. 6 7 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That the Joint Study Commission 8 on Grocery Taxation is established. 9 (a) The purpose of the commission is to study a 10 11 proposed elimination of the sales and use tax on food items 12 pursuant to state law and evaluate the impact of eliminating 13 the sales and use tax on, but not limited to, the following: 14 (1) Household expenditure by Alabama residents, with 15 focus on those whose incomes are below the Federal Poverty Level and those whose incomes extend above the Federal 16 17 Poverty Level to at least the median household income for the state. 18 (2) The Education Trust Fund, both in isolation and 19 in relation to the remainder of the state budget. 20 21 (3) Revenue collection by political subdivisions. 22 (4) Community food banks and nonprofit organizations that provide food. 23 24 (5) Hunger and malnutrition, especially relating to 25 children and the elderly. 26 (b) The members of the commission shall include all 27 of the following: 28 (1) The Minority Leader of the Senate, or his or her 29 designee. 30 (2) The Chair of the Senate Finance and Taxation 31 Education Committee, or his or her designee. (3) The primary sponsor of Senate Bill 257 of the 32 2023 Regular Session, or his or her designee. 33 34 (4) The Minority Leader of the House of Representatives, or his or her designee. 35 36 (5) The Chair of the House Ways and Means Education Committee, or his or her designee. 37 38 (6) The primary House sponsor of this resolution, or 39 her designee. 40 (7) A member appointed by the Lieutenant Governor. 41 (8) A member appointed by the Speaker of the House of 42 Representatives. 43 (9) A representative of a nonprofit organization appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate. 44 45 (10) A representative of the Alabama Grocers 46 Association, appointed by the association. 47 (11) A representative of the National Federation of Independent Business (NFIB), appointed by the NFIB. 48



49 (c) Designees or appointees to the commission shall 50 reflect the racial, gender, geographic, urban, rural, and 51 economic diversity of the state.

52 (d) (1) Appointments to the commission shall be made53 within 30 days after the effective date of this act.

54 (2) The primary sponsor of Senate Bill 257 and the 55 primary House sponsor of this resolution shall co-chair the commission. The initial meeting of the commission shall be 56 called by the co-chairs and shall be held no later than 57 December 1, 2023, at which time the commission shall assign 58 59 study and reporting responsibilities to the members. 60 Thereafter, the commission shall meet no less than once each 61 year.

(e) (1) The Department of Revenue shall prepare and
deliver to each member of the commission a report once each
quarter on the revenue from sales and use tax collection on
grocery sales.

66 (2) The Department of Revenue, upon request of any
67 commission member, shall provide other information that the
68 department possesses.

(f) (1) The legislative members of the commission shall be entitled to their legislative compensation, per diem, and travel expenses for each day they attend a meeting of the commission in accordance with Section 49 of the Constitution of Alabama of 2022.



74 (2) The non-legislative members of the commission 75 shall serve without compensation but may be reimbursed for necessary expenses in attending commission meetings pursuant 76 77 to the policies of the respective appointing authority. 78 (g)(1) The commission shall annually report to the 79 Lieutenant Governor and the Speaker of the House of Representatives on the number of times it met during the 80 preceding 12 months, and shall include minutes of its 81 meetings, with any interim recommendations or requests that 82 83 may assist its work. 84 (2)a. The commission shall prepare a final report of its findings, conclusions, and recommendations for any 85 86 proposed legislation to eliminate the sales and use tax on groceries no later than November 1, 2026. 87 b. The final report shall be delivered to the 88 89 Lieutenant Governor, the President Pro Tempore of the 90 Senate, the Majority Leader of the Senate, the Minority Leader of the Senate, the Chair of the Senate Finance and 91 Taxation Education Committee, the Speaker of the House of 92 Representatives, the Majority Leader of the House of 93 94 Representatives, the Minority Leader of the House of 95 Representatives, and the Chair of the House Ways and Means Education Committee. 96

97 c. Upon filing its final report the commission shall98 be dissolved.



99 (h) Pursuant to Section 36-14-17.1, Code of Alabama 100 1975, the commission shall provide to the Secretary of State 101 a notice of all meetings, the name of each member serving on 102 the commission, a copy of the final report, and other 103 interim reports or studies produced throughout the duration 104 of its existence.
