14	University in Washington, D.C.; and
15	WHEREAS, Mrs. Walton and Allen Walton were united in
16	holy matrimony in Macon on June 16, 1945, and they moved to
17	Tuskegee, Alabama, on June 30, 1945; their union was blessed
18	with four children, eight grandchildren, nine
19	great-grandchildren, and one great-great-grandchild; and
20	WHEREAS, Mrs. Walton was initiated into Delta Sigma
21	Theta Sorority, Alpha Zeta Chapter at Talladega College on
22	November 15, 1941, and has remained active throughout the
23	years; she is a Golden Life Member; her first term as
24	President of the chapter was from 1952-1954, and her second
25	term as President of the Tuskegee Alumnae Chapter was from
26	1971-1974; notable accomplishments during her tenures as
27	President include receiving a visit from Founder Vashti

43	Andrew's Episcopal Church and has served in many capacities,
