4 HR_____ HONORING MR. DEWEY J. BONDURANT, JR. FOR SERVING AS
5 THE MAYOR OF FLOMATON, ALABAMA, FOR 23 YEARS.

7 WHEREAS, with great pride and special pleasure, we 8 highly honor Mr. Dewey J. Bondurant, Jr. for diligently 9 serving as the Mayor of Flomaton, Alabama, for 23 years 10 before retiring in April 2023; and

11 WHEREAS, Mayor Bondurant graduated from Flomaton High 12 School in 1965 and from Auburn University in 1969; he was a 13 teacher and coach at Flomaton High School, left his 14 education career to help manage his family business, and 15 became a business and civic leader in his hometown of 16 Flomaton; and

17 WHEREAS, in 1984, Mayor Bondurant became a leader in 18 the town's park committee; under his leadership and with the 19 support of the city fathers and the community, a modern, new 20 park facility, Hurricane Park, was constructed with minimal 21 funds required; the park opened to the public in 1985; and

22 WHEREAS, in 2000, with the desire to serve the 23 people, he was elected Mayor; Mayor Bondurant became the 24 leader of efforts to complete the four-laning of Highway 113 25 from Flomaton to Interstate-65 with the goal of making the 26 highway a key corridor for traffic flow to the Gulf Coast, 27 an important emergency escape route during hurricanes, and a 28 project that would have an important economic impact on the

29 community; against great odds, Mayor Bondurant and his team, 30 along with supporters from Florida and cooperation of 31 Governor Bob Riley, the project was completed in November 32 2008; continuing work to improve Flomaton, Mayor Bondurant 33 and others made major drainage storm improvements in the downtown area and constructed a new firehouse, a new and 34 35 modern library, and a new and modern Town Hall; through his 36 years of service, Mayor Bondurant was known for his ability 37 to raise funds for public use in improvements with minimal 38 local funds; and

39 WHEREAS, the citizens of Flomaton are forever 40 grateful for Mayor Bondurant's many years of dedicated 41 service; Mayor Bondurant's service and accomplishments will 42 be appreciated by the citizens of Flomaton for years to 43 come; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, That Mayor Dewey J. Bondurant, Jr. is highly honored and appreciated for his years of service and accomplishments, and it is appropriate that Hurricane Park in Flomaton, Alabama, be renamed Dewey J. Bondurant, Jr. Park.
