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24 Relating to correctional incentive time; to amend Section 25 14-9-41, as last amended by Act 2022-322, 2022 Regular 26 Session, Code of Alabama 1975, to reduce the amount of 27 correctional incentive time a prisoner receives; to require a 28 prisoner to remain in a certain classification for a longer 29 period of time before moving up to a higher classification; to 30 provide for additional circumstances in which a prisoner may 31 be required to forfeit his or her correctional incentive time; 32 and to require the Department of Corrections to provide annual 33 reports to the Legislature, the Governor, and the Attorney 34 General regarding correctional incentive time.
