SYNOPSIS:

Under existing law, the members of the Alabama State Board of Veterinary Medical Examiners receive a daily stipend for each day, or portion of a day, in which the member is actually engaged in the work of the board.

This bill would increase the amount of the daily stipend for board members from two hundred dollars (\$200) to six hundred dollars (\$600).

A BILL  
TO BE ENTITLED  
AN ACT

Relating to the Alabama State Board of Veterinary Medical Examiners; to amend Section 34-29-67, Code of Alabama 1975, to increase the daily stipend for board members; and to authorize the board to increase the amount of the daily stipend at its discretion by rule.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. Section 34-29-67, Code of Alabama 1975, is amended to read as follows:

"§34-29-67

(a) The members of the board shall receive ~~two~~six

29 hundred dollars ~~(\$200)~~ (\$600) ~~a day~~ for each day, or a portion  
30 thereof, the member is actually engaged in the work of the  
31 board, and in addition, the usual per diem expenses allowed to  
32 other persons acting in the service of the State of Alabama or  
33 any of its agencies, institutions, boards, bureaus, or  
34 commissions.

35 (b) The legal expenses of the board for administration  
36 of this article shall be paid from funds in the State Treasury  
37 to the credit of the board and shall be paid only on warrant  
38 of the State Treasurer and approved by the Governor. No funds  
39 shall be withdrawn or expended except as budgeted and allotted  
40 pursuant to Title 41, Chapter 4, Article 4, and only in  
41 amounts as stipulated in the general appropriations act."

42 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first  
43 day of the third month following its passage and approval by  
44 the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
