SYNOPSIS:

This bill would add one House member and one Senate member to the Contract Review Permanent Legislative Oversight Committee, which is responsible for reviewing certain state contracts for personal or professional services with private entities or individuals.

A BILL  
TO BE ENTITLED  
AN ACT

Relating to the Contract Review Permanent Legislative Oversight Committee; to amend Section 29-2-40, Code of Alabama 1975, to provide further for membership of the committee.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. Section 29-2-40, Code of Alabama 1975, is amended to read as follows:

"§29-2-40

(a) There is created the Contract Review Permanent Legislative Oversight Committee. The committee shall be composed of the Chairs of the Senate Finance and Taxation General Fund Committee and the Senate Finance and Taxation Education Committee and the Chairs of the House Ways and Means

29 General Fund Committee and the House Ways and Means Education  
30 Committee, and ~~three~~four additional members of the Senate, to  
31 be appointed by the President of the Senate, and ~~three~~four  
32 additional members of the House, to be appointed by the  
33 Speaker of the House.

34 (b) A member of the committee may serve on the  
35 committee as long as the member retains the office that  
36 qualified the member for service or during the term to which  
37 the member was appointed and, if reelected to the same house  
38 without a break in service to that house, during the  
39 succeeding legislative term until a successor is appointed as  
40 provided in subsection (a)."

41 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first  
42 day of the third month following its passage and approval by  
43 the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
