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4	SYNOPSIS:
5	Under existing law, the salary of the circuit
6	clerks in the state's judicial system is based on the
7	pay plan of the Unified Judicial System.
8	This bill would revise the salary of all circuit
9	clerks in the state's judicial system, including the
10	Deputy Circuit Clerk of the Bessemer Division of the
11	Tenth Judicial Circuit, to increase the pay grade for
12	circuit clerks beginning the next term of office in
13	January 2025 based on the pay plan adopted by the
14	personnel system of the Unified Judicial System, as
15	amended.
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17	A BILL
18	TO BE ENACTED
19	AN ACT
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21	To amend Section 12-17-81 of the Code of Alabama 1975,
22	to further provide for the salary of all circuit clerks in the
23	Unified Judicial System based on the pay plan adopted by the
24	personnel system of the Unified Judicial System.
25	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
26	Section 1. Section 12-17-81 of the Code of Alabama
27	1975, is amended to read as follows:

29 "\$12-17-81

30 (a) For the purposes of this section, the following31 terms shall have the following meanings:

32 (1) ANNIVERSARY DATE. Annually, the first Monday after33 the second Tuesday in January.

34 (2) CIRCUIT CLERKS. All circuit clerks in the Unified
 35 Judicial System and the Deputy Circuit Clerk of the Bessemer
 36 Division in the Tenth Judicial Circuit.

37 (2)(3) PAY PLAN. The pay plan adopted by the Unified 38 Judicial System personnel system, or its successor entity, 39 providing the pay range with steps, as the same may be amended 40 from time to time.

41 (3) (4) STATE SALARY. The annual salary of circuit
 42 clerks and district clerks payable from the State Treasury.

43 (b) Effective January 18, 1999, the annual salary of circuit clerks and district clerks, who first take office by 44 appointment or election on or after January 18, 1999, payable 45 46 from the State Treasury shall be fixed at step one of the pay plan for Assistant Clerk of the Court of Criminal Appeals. 47 48 Thereafter, the state salary of circuit clerks and district 49 clerks shall be increased annually, on the anniversary date, 50 by one step on the pay plan until the maximum step authorized by the pay plan is reached. This section shall not diminish 51 any local supplement currently provided to any circuit clerk 52 53 or district clerk pursuant to any general or local act; provided further that nothing in this section as amended by 54 Act 98-301 of the 1998 Regular Session shall serve to increase 55 56 any local supplement in effect on July 1, 1998. In no event

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57	shall the annual state salary of any circuit clerk or district
58	clerk be diminished by this section.
59	(c) Effective January 18, 1999, the state salary
60	payable to circuit clerks and district clerks, who are already
61	serving in office on that date and who have not more than six
62	years of service, shall be an amount equal to step five of the
63	pay plan for Assistant Clerk of the Court of Criminal Appeals.
64	The state salary shall be increased on January 17, 2000, or on
65	the anniversary date of creditable service, to step six of the
66	pay plan. Beginning on the anniversary date in the year 2002,
67	and annually thereafter, the state salary shall be increased
68	in an amount equal to one step in the pay plan until the
69	maximum step authorized by the pay plan is reached.
70	(d) Effective January 18, 1999, the state salary
71	payable to circuit clerks and district clerks, who are in
72	office on that date and who have not less than six and not
73	more than 12 years of service, shall be an amount equal to
74	fifty-four thousand dollars (\$54,000), plus one-third of the
75	difference between fifty-four thousand dollars (\$54,000) and
76	step 12 of the pay plan for Assistant Clerk of the Court of
77	Criminal Appeals. The state salary shall be increased on
78	January 17, 2000, to an amount equal to fifty-four thousand
79	dollars (\$54,000), plus two-thirds of the difference between
80	fifty-four thousand dollars (\$54,000) and step 12 of the pay
81	plan. The state salary shall be increased on January 15, 2001,
82	or on the anniversary date of creditable service, to an amount
83	equal to step 12 of the pay plan. Beginning on the anniversary
84	date in the year 2002, and annually thereafter, the state

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85	salary shall be increased in an amount equal to one step in
86	the pay plan until the maximum step authorized by the pay plan
87	is reached.
88	(e) Effective January 18, 1999, the state salary
89	payable to circuit clerks and district clerks, who are in
90	office on that date and who have more than 12 years of
91	service, shall be an amount equal to fifty-four thousand

92 dollars (\$54,000), plus one-third of the difference between

93 fifty-four thousand dollars (\$54,000) and step 18 of the pay
94 plan for Assistant Clerk of the Court of Criminal Appeals. The

95 state salary shall be increased on January 17, 2000, to an

96 amount equal to fifty-four thousand dollars (\$54,000), plus

97 two-thirds of the difference between fifty-four thousand

98 dollars (\$54,000) and step 18 of the pay plan for Assistant

99 Clerk of the Court of Criminal Appeals. The state salary shall 100 be increased on January 15, 2001, or on the anniversary date

101 of creditable service, to an amount equal to step 18 of the 102 pay plan.

103 (f) Notwithstanding the provisions of this section as amended by Act 98-301 of the 1998 Regular Session, no circuit or district clerk shall receive any salary increase for state comployees which is enacted to apply effective FY 1999. (b) Effective beginning with the term of office commencing in January 2025, the annual salary of circuit

109 clerks who first take office by appointment or election on or

110 after that date payable from the State Treasury shall be fixed

111 at step one of pay grade 86 of the pay plan and the annual

112 salary of circuit clerks serving in office prior to that date

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113	and continuing to serve who are receiving a salary in pay
114	grade 84 shall be fixed at the corresponding step in pay grade
115	86 of the pay plan. Thereafter, the state salary of circuit
116	clerks shall be increased annually on the anniversary date, by
117	one step on the pay plan until the maximum step authorized by
118	the pay plan is reached.
119	(c) This section shall not diminish any local
120	supplement provided to a circuit clerk pursuant to any general
121	or local act in effect on of the effective date of the act
122	adding this language; provided further that nothing in this
123	section shall increase any local supplement. In no event shall
124	the annual state salary of any circuit clerk be diminished by
125	this section."
126	Section 2. This act shall become effective beginning
127	the next term of circuit clerks beginning in January 2025,
128	following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its
129	otherwise becoming law.
