A BILL
TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT

Relating to criminal procedure; to require law enforcement agencies to collect fingerprints and DNA from any illegal alien in the agency's custody and submit the fingerprints and DNA for testing or cataloging.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. (a) Whenever a law enforcement agency in this state has an illegal alien in its custody, the law enforcement agency may not release the illegal alien until the law enforcement agency has collected a full set of fingerprints and a known DNA reference sample from the individual.

(b) Following the collection of any fingerprints or DNA pursuant to this section, a law enforcement agency shall submit the fingerprints to the Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency for cataloging and shall submit the known DNA reference sample to the Alabama Department of Forensic Sciences for analysis and entry into the appropriate databases.

Section 2. This act shall become effective immediately following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
