TRACT SIX


All of the right-of-way, and the road and territory inclusive lying between the right-of-way, along Alabama Highway 79 beginning at the present northern corporate boundary of the Town of Skyline, Alabama, on said highway and extending north to the endpoint, at the southern corporate boundaries of the Town of Hytop, Alabama immediately south of said highway's intersection with Alabama Highway 146; and

72 TRACT SEVEN

All of the right-of-way, and the road and territory inclusive lying between the right-of-way, along Jackson County Road 144, beginning where Alabama Highway 79 intersects County Road 144, extending 0.96 miles north and east along said right-of-way until the end point in Jackson County, Alabama.

Section 2. In accordance with Section 11-42-6 of the Code of Alabama 1975, a map showing the proposed territory to be annexed to the municipality of Skyline is on file and open to public inspection in the Office of the Judge of Probate in Jackson County, Alabama.

Section 3. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by





the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
