A BILL
TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT

To alter, rearrange, and extend the boundary lines and corporate limits of the municipality of Skyline in Jackson County.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. The boundary lines and corporate limits of the municipality of Skyline in Jackson County are altered, rearranged, and extended to include within the corporate limits of the municipality, in addition to the lands now included, all of the following territory:

TRACT ONE

All of the Eastern one-half of the right-of-way, and the road and territory inclusive lying therein the Eastern one-half of the right-of-way, along Jackson County Road 544, bounded on the south by the present corporate boundaries of the municipality of Skyline, thence, from the intersection of said county road with Alabama Highway 146, north along and encompassing the right-of-way, and the road and territory inclusive lying therein of Alabama Highway 146 to the center of said highway's intersection with Jackson County Road 138; thence from the intersection of said highway with Jackson County Road 138, north along and encompassing the

29 right-of-way, and the road and territory inclusive lying
30 therein of County Road 138 extending 1.7 miles along said
31 right-of-way until the end point in Jackson County, Alabama;

TRACT TWO

33 All of the right-of-way, and the road and territory
34 inclusive lying between the right-of-way, along Jackson County
35 Road 17, bounded on the north by the present southern
36 corporate boundaries of the municipality of Skyline on said
37 county road, extending 2.1 miles along said right-of-way until
38 the end point in Jackson County, Alabama;

TRACT THREE

40 All of the right-of-way, and the road and territory
41 inclusive lying between the right-of-way, along Jackson County
42 Road 15, beginning where County Road 17 intersects County Road
43 15, extending 0.82 miles along said right-of-way until the end
44 point in Jackson County, Alabama;

TRACT FOUR

46 All of the right-of-way, and the road and territory
47 inclusive lying between the right-of-way, along Jackson County
48 Road 317, beginning where County Road 17 intersects County
49 Road 317 at each end of a .13 mile long loop, encompassing the
50 entirety of the right-of-way of said loop, then along said
51 county road, extending from the point at which said loop joins
52 to form one roadway 1.18 miles along said right-of-way until
53 the end point in Jackson County, Alabama;

58 TRACT FIVE

59 All of the right-of-way, and the road and territory
60 inclusive lying between the right-of-way, along Jackson County
61 Road 222, beginning where County Road 17 intersects County
62 Road 222, extending 0.35 miles along said right-of-way until
63 the end point in Jackson County, Alabama;

64 TRACT SIX

65 All of the right-of-way, and the road and territory
66 inclusive lying between the right-of-way, along Alabama
67 Highway 79 beginning at the present northern corporate
68 boundary of the Town of Skyline, Alabama, on said highway and
69 extending north to the endpoint, at the southern corporate
70 boundaries of the Town of Hytop, Alabama immediately south of
71 said highway's intersection with Alabama Highway 146; and

72 TRACT SEVEN

73 All of the right-of-way, and the road and territory
74 inclusive lying between the right-of-way, along Jackson County
75 Road 144, beginning where Alabama Highway 79 intersects County
76 Road 144, extending 0.96 miles north and east along said
77 right-of-way until the end point in Jackson County, Alabama.

78 Section 2. In accordance with Section 11-42-6 of the
79 Code of Alabama 1975, a map showing the proposed territory to
80 be annexed to the municipality of Skyline is on file and open
81 to public inspection in the Office of the Judge of Probate in
82 Jackson County, Alabama.

83 Section 3. This act shall become effective on the first
84 day of the third month following its passage and approval by
