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4	SYNOPSIS:
5	Under existing law, the state pays each board or
6	registrar a salary of eighty dollars (\$80) per day for
7	each day of service.
8	This bill would increase the salary of each
9	board of registrar.
10	Also under existing law, a county commission may
11	allow a member of the county board of registrars who
12	has served for at least 16 years to participate in any
13	health insurance program provided by the county.
14	This bill would provide that a county may allow
15	any member of the county board of registrars to
16	participate in any health insurance program provided by
17	the county.
18	This bill would also make nonsubstantive,
19	technical revisions to update the existing code
20	language to current style.

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Relating to boards of registrars; to amend Section 17-3-5, Code of Alabama 1975, to increase the salary of each

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- 29 board of registrar; to provide that a county may allow any
- 30 member of the county board of registrars to participate in any

- 32 nonsubstantive, technical revisions to update the existing
- 33 code language to current style.
- 34 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
- 35 Section 1. Section 17-3-5, Code of Alabama 1975, is
- 36 amended to read as follows:
- 37 "\$17-3-5
- 38 (a) Each registrar shall receive a salary in the amount
- of cightyone hundred dollars (\$80) (\$100) per day for each
- day's attendance upon business of the board, to be paid by the
- 41 state and disbursed to the county commissions and disbursed by
- the county commissions to each registrar on order of a quorum
- of the board of registrars of the county. The state
- 44 Comptroller shall issue to each county commission on a monthly
- 45 basis an amount sufficient to fund these payments plus the
- 46 employer share of the Social Security or Federal Insurance
- 47 Corporation Act tax. The county commission will provide to the
- 48 state Comptroller an invoice itemized to reflect payments
- 49 made. If a legal holiday falls on a day the board is to be in
- session, and the courthouse of the county is closed for the
- 51 holiday, the board of registrars shall be compensated for the
- 52 holiday. Each registrar shall receive a mileage allowance
- 53 equal to the amount allowed state employees or employees of
- 54 the county, whichever is greater, for official travel in the
- 55 course of attending the business of the board, including
- 56 attending continuing education programs. Travel and other

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expenses shall be paid by the county commissions to the boards of registrars, and the state shall reimburse the county commissions based on a written request submitted by the county commissions to the state Comptroller.

- (b) The provisions of this section regarding travel mileage shall not apply in any county having a population of 600,000 or more inhabitants according to the 1970 or any succeeding federal decennial census, and any currently effective local law or general law of local application regarding travel mileage for registrars in the county shall remain in full force and effect and shall not be repealed by operation of this chapter.
- (c) Members of the boards of registrars of this state are hereby declared to be state employees for the purposes of Chapter 28 of Title 36.
- (d) Members of the boards of registrars of this state shall be treated as equals with other state and county employees in regard to Social Security protection and benefits.
- (e) All payments by a county to any member of a county board of registrars (except for mileage or reimbursement for expenses), except for mileage or reimbursement for expenses, shall be treated for Social Security purposes equally with payments by that county to other county employees of the county.
- (f) The state office for Social Security and the state

  Comptroller and each county commission are directed to shall

  take all necessary action to insure ensure that members of the

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- boards of registrars of this state are treated as other state and county employees in regard to Social Security protection and benefits as provided in Chapter 28 of Title 36, including, if necessary, amending the federal-state agreement referred to in Chapter 28 of Title 36, to implement the intent of the Legislature as expressed herein.
  - (g) No county commission may reduce the current county supplement upon the effect of this section by implementation of Act 94-693.

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- (h) A county commission may allow the chair or any member of the county board of registrars who has served at least 16 years in that position to participate in any health insurance program provided by the county upon the same terms, conditions, and employee contributions as required for county employees.
- This subsection shall not apply to any health insurance plans administered by the State of Alabama as described in Title 36, Chapter 29 and Title 11, Chapter 91A."
- Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
