6	WHEREAS, it is with profound sorrow that we note the
7	death on April 14, 2023, of Mr. Guy Edward "Buddy" Moman,
8	Jr. of Tuscaloosa, Alabama, at the age of 81; and
9	WHEREAS, his passing leaves a void in the lives of
10	his loving family, many friends, and the entire community,
11	where he was highly regarded; and
12	WHEREAS, Mr. Moman was born on September 2, 1941, in
13	Tuscaloosa, Alabama, to Guy Edward Moman, Sr. and Helen
14	Levenia Malone Moman; and
15	WHEREAS, Mr. Moman graduated from The University of
16	Alabama, where he was a member of the Million Dollar Band;
17	in 1963, he entered business with his father as a
18	distributor of periodicals and books in Alabama,
19	Mississippi, South Carolina, and Tennessee; he was the Chief
20	Executive Officer of GEMCO Corporation at the time of his
21	retirement in 1996; in the periodical industry, he served as
22	Vice President of Atlantic Coastal Independent Distribution
23	Association and as Chairman of the Council for Periodical
24	Distributors Associations; and

26 community, some of Mr. Moman's other achievements included 27 serving as Chairman of the Black Warrior Council, Boy Scouts 28 of America; being inducted into the Boy Scouts Circle of 29 Honor in 2016; serving as Director of Regions Bank; being a 30 member of the Family Counseling Service Board; serving as 31 Treasurer of the West Alabama Rehabilitation Center Board; 32 serving as President of the Exchange Club of Tuscaloosa; and being a board member of the Rotary Club and of the United 33 Way Alexis de Tocqueville Society; and 34 35 WHEREAS, Mr. Moman enjoyed spending time with his

36 family and friends, building and flying his full-sized model 37 airplanes, and boating; and
