4 SJR___ UPHOLDING THE LANGUAGE OF THE FEDERAL INDIAN ARTS AND 5 CRAFTS ACT IN REGARD TO STATE RECOGNIZED INDIAN TRIBES.

7 WHEREAS, on May 8, 1984, by act of the Alabama 8 Legislature and signed into law by the Governor, Alabama is 9 the home of eight State recognized tribal governments: the 10 Machis Lower Creek Indian Tribe of Alabama, the Echota Cherokee Tribe of Alabama, the Cherokee Tribe of Northeast 11 Alabama, the Cherokee Tribe of Southeast Alabama, the MOWA 12 13 Band of Choctaw Indians, the Southeastern MVSKOKE Nation, 14 the Piqua Shawnee, and the United Cherokee ANI-YUN-WIYA 15 Nation; and

16 WHEREAS, under the Indian Arts and Crafts Act of 1990 17 (P.L. 101-644), "Indian" is defined as a member of a 18 federally or officially State recognized tribe or a 19 certified Indian Artisan; and

20 WHEREAS, the United States Senate Committee on Indian 21 Affairs is taking comments regarding the Indian Arts and 22 Crafts Act for amendment, and comments have been made to 23 request the committee to remove State recognized Indians 24 from the Act; now therefore,

25 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH 26 HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That the State of Alabama is in 27 full and complete support of Alabama's first citizens, and 28 we uphold the State recognition of each of the tribes listed



29 above.

30 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That we support the 31 continuation of State recognized tribes under the Indian 32 Arts and Crafts Act; we also support the addition of the 33 Native Hawaiians to the act.
